BLOOMINGTON - On Sunday, the congregation of Bloomington Christian Associated Gospel Church conclude celebrations of their 150th anniversary with special services at 11 a.m. and

7 p.m. Hoover History of the congregation dates back to 1833 when a church was erected on the east side of the Ninth Line across from the present building. While no minutes are available for the first 34 years, it is believed that Thomas McIntyre was the first minister. All the early coun-

try churches were served by travelling pastors, bearing the title Elder or Brother. These preachers lacked formal education of any kind, but this was balanced by a fiery enthusiasm and a self-discipline that prompted them to conscientiously search the Scriptures and then travel by foot or by horseback to encourage, inspire and exhort their isolated congregations to live worthy of the name Christian.

The work of the Sunday School was organized at the same time and was a real factor in building up of the church. This remains a vital part of continuing community service with classes for all ages.

On Sept. 23, 1891, Elijah Johnson offered to build a new house of worship to be located on the west side of the Ninth Line, provided other members would agree to furnish the land and haul the later changing its

She went Home to be with her Lord in September and is sadly missed by all who had the privilege of knowing
