Local church women gather for day of worship

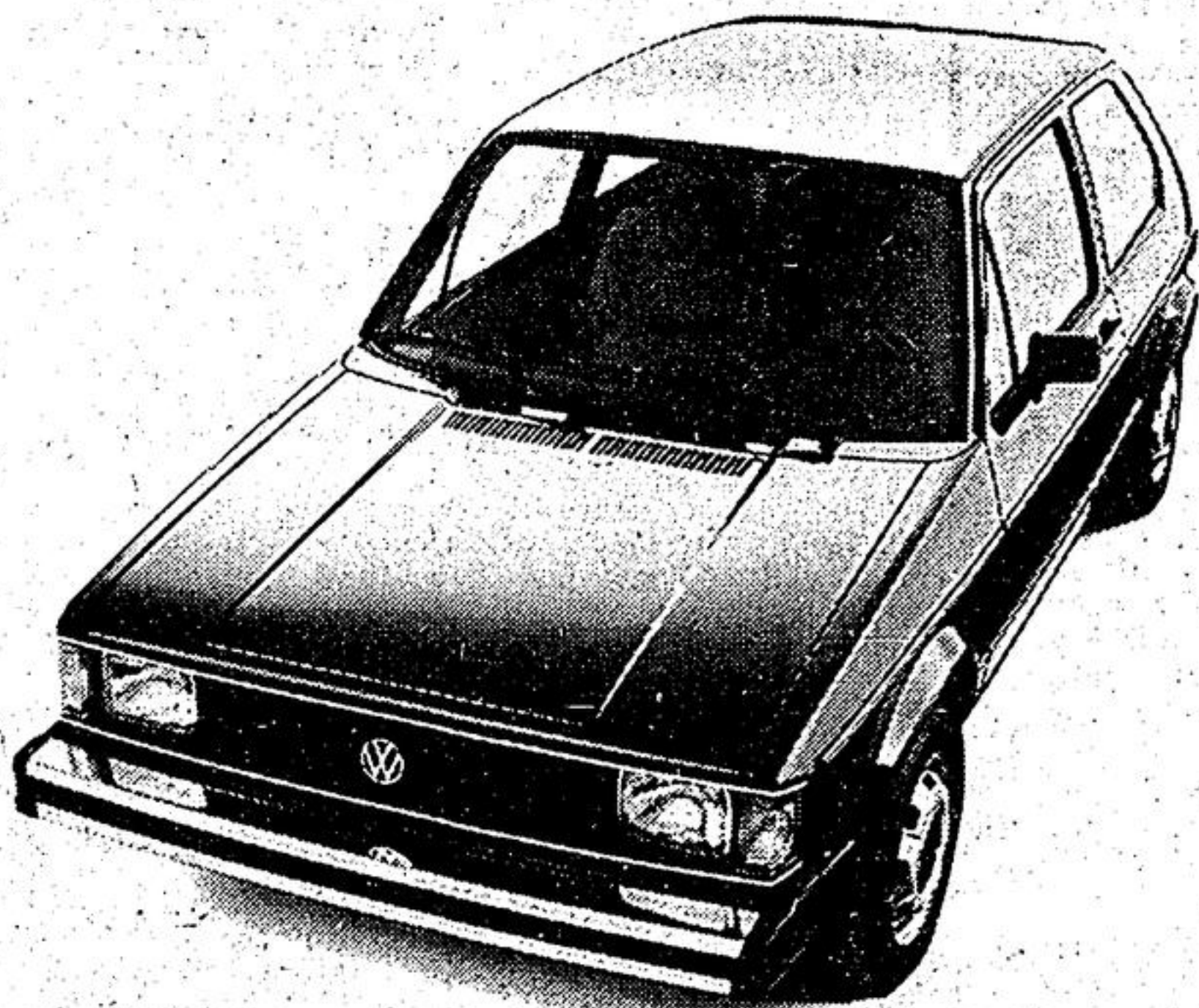
