Trevor Bardell set up Dale Bull's opener for the Clippers, with Darrin Zeller putting on a star performance with a hat trick in the second period, two of them on assists from Chris Spearen and Geoff Smith.

Uxbridge avoided a shutout with a lone marker in the third period, while Zeller continued his rampage with two more goals, assists coming from Sam Yoshida and Bull.

Spearen rounded out the Clipper win on Bull's assist.

Juniors seventh loss

Asked how he felt about seven losses in a row, he concluded "Seven is a good round figure to stop at." This Saturday, the Clippers host Bowmanville at 7:30pm. Next away game is at Lindsay on Nov. 30.
