MARKHAM HYDRO ELECTRIC COMMISSION 1984 RATE SCHEDULE

Ontario Hydro has announced the wholesale cost of power to Markham Hydro will increase by 8.4% on January 1, 1984. Approximately 1.3% of this increase is to subsidize the Ontario Hydro rural rate.

Markham Hydro Commission through careful budgeting and economy measures has been successful in absorbing a portion of this increase regardless of substantially higher utility operating costs.

After careful consideration the Commission has recommended an average rate increase of 8.0% for residential and 7.9% for general service customers and if approved by Ontario Hydro will take effect January 1, 1984.
