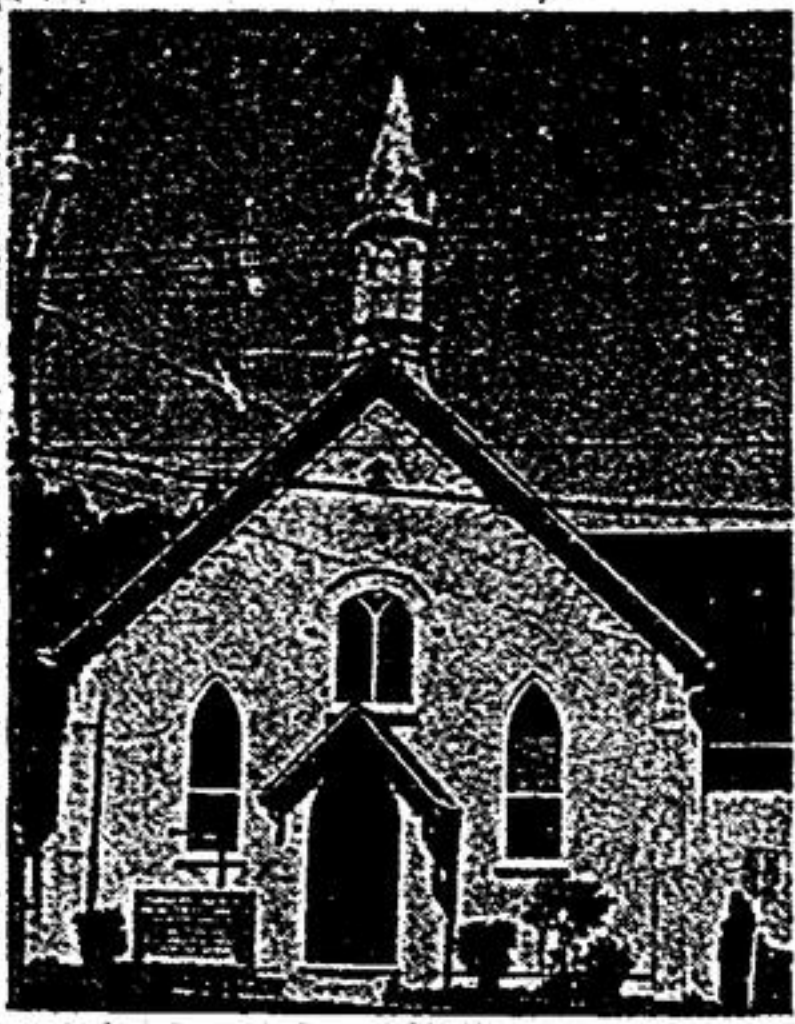

 The exterior illumination at the site of Farquharson Real Estate, has transformed the local office into a Main Street show place.

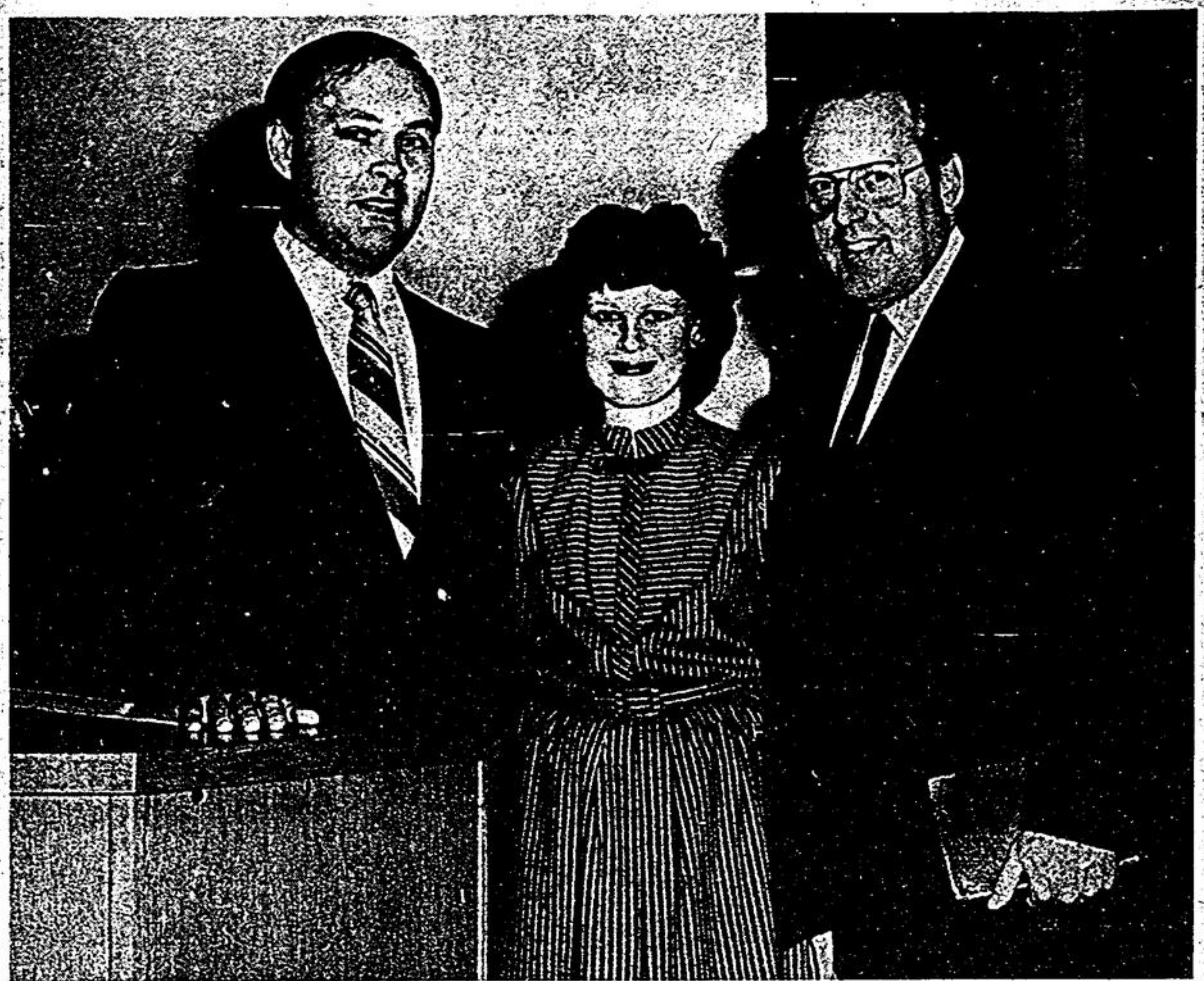
**RESIDENT AT PARKVIEW**

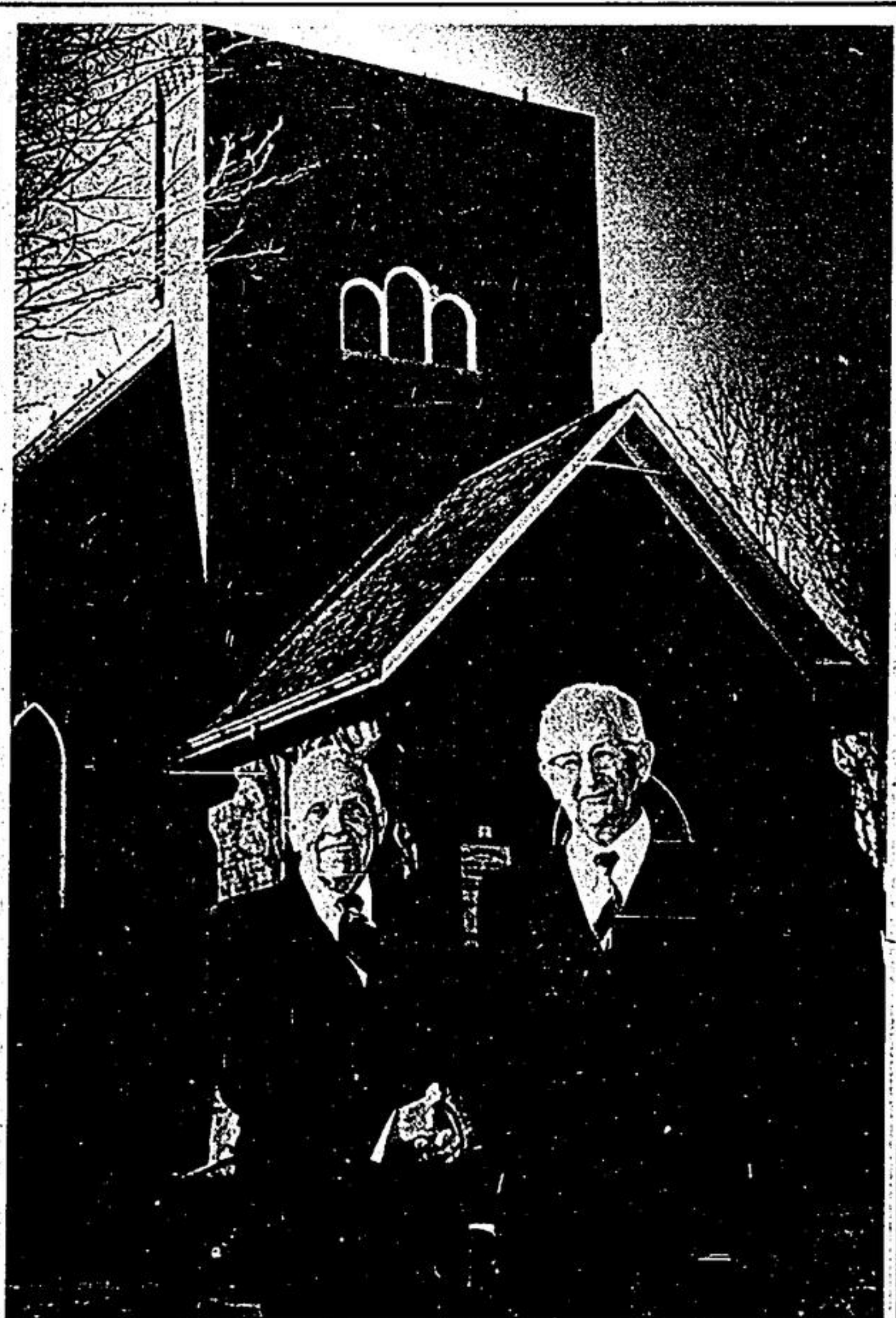
**CHRISTMAS IN BRAZIL**
