Collision

UXBRIDGE — Monday morning's icy weather conditions were a contributing factor in a chain reaction, four vehicle pile-up which caused Regional Road 23 to be closed for about two hours said Durham Regional Police, Uxbridge 26 Division.

The total damage was estimated at \$11,000 and police said there were no major injuries.

At 8 a.m. (Nov. 28) Robert Dymont, of Whitby, was driving northbound on Regional Road 23 near Chalk Lake. As he attempted to slow down to make a left-hand turn into Dagmar Ski resort his car slide on the some ice.

As the car slide, the rear vehicle, driven by Wolfedale Schlombs, of Jordan, Ontario, swerved onto the shoulder and lost control.

Mr. Schlombs' car was hit by a southbound Coca-Cola truck, which was driven by Calvin Avison, of Whitby. When the two vehicles collided the truck went off the road and down an embankment. The first car, driven by Mr. Dymont, was then hit by another southbound car, driven by Harold Wilcock, of Uxbridge.
