HEISE HILL — Funeral service was held from Heise Hill Brethern in Christ Church, Dec. 29 for Mrs Isador Wideman, following her passing at Parkview Home, Stouffville, Dec. 27. She was 91.

Mrs Wideman, the former Ella Heise, was born at Heise Hill, one of four in the family of John and Annie Heise. She was predeceased by two sisters, Effie and Annie and a brother Joe.

Mrs Wideman was a life-long member of the Heise Hill Church congregation. She served as a Sunday School teacher and assisted at quilting bees with products of her handiwork going to families in the community or to the auction for overseas relief at Pioneer Village.

Attending Saturday market at Newmarket was a regular weekend event.

Isador and Ella Wideman were extremely close, an association often admired by Parkview residents. They moved there from Gormley about ten years ago.

Besides her husband, she is survived by three sons and daughters-in-law—Harold and Dorothy Wideman; Earl and Grace Wideman and Glen and Jean Wideman, all of R.R. 1, Gormley. There are 15 grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

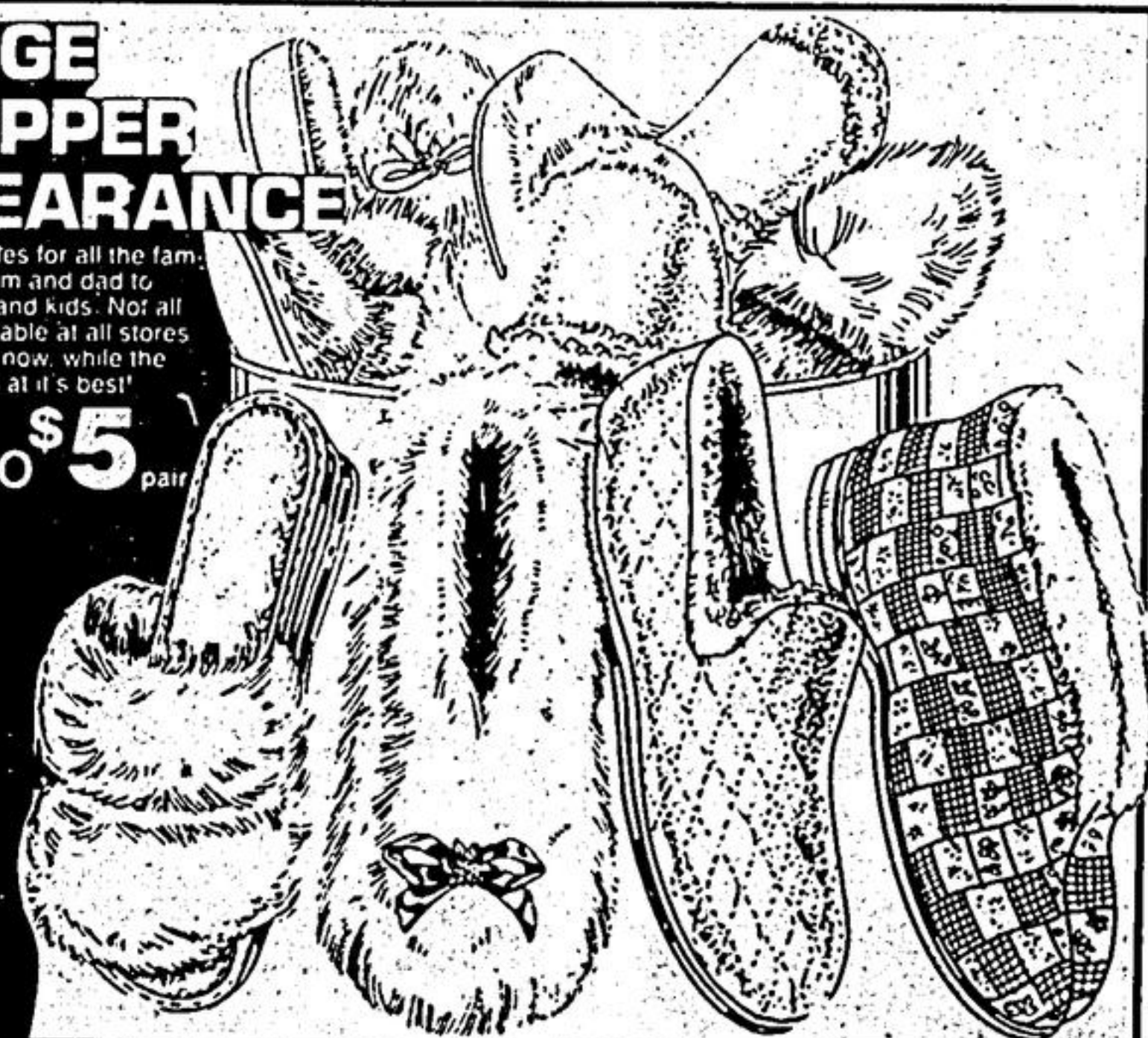
