MARKHAM — Net earnings by the 1983 Markham and East York Agricultural Society, (Markham Fair), totalled \$64,881.00, it was revealed at the annual meeting, Jan. 11.

This is up from \$61,868.00 in 1982 for an increase of \$3,013.00.

While receipts (excluding grants) increased considerably, (\$404,479.00 compared to \$396,489.00), expenses also rose, (\$316,048.00 compared to \$308,190.00).

On the earnings side, admissions set an all-time record at \$184,879.00. This was \$11,534.00 over 1982. With respect to expenses, repairs and maintenance totalled \$35,254.00, up from \$29,687.00.

Rogers Gardham, finance committee chairman, described the statement of earnings and expenses as "generally speaking, very good".

"There's a limit," he said, "to how much can be brought in during five nights and four days." He noted that as the Fair grows, expenses will also grow.

"Success," he concluded, "should be measured by the number of people involved in putting the Fair on and by the number of people who come to see it".
