Competing in the 'C' division, the Clippers faced Stittsville for their first game of the tournament, coming away with a hard-fought 6-6 tie.

Goals came from Ron Graham, Bill Ormson, Joe Infurnari, Wayne McMann and Bob (Round) McKinnon; the tie goal coming from skipper Bob McNeil.

The fact that they were playing in a much tougher 'C' division, as opposed to their previous 'D' status, along with their injured list, proved to be an overwhelming obstacle for Clipper hopes.

However, the players and their families thoroughly enjoyed themselves. Staying at the newly-built Westin Hotel, standing amidst the Parliament buildings, Rideau Canal, War Museum and Rideau Centre, they took in some of the sights and had a traditional skate along the Canal.
