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Dining with Cal

Tonight, Cathryn and I visit the Corkscrew Restaurant, 7225 Woodbine Avenue, Markham. Dress here ranges from casual to semi-formal. We both enjoy come-as-you-are dining.

Lighting here is very low. It should be turned up so the diner can appreciate the look of the meal as well as the taste.

Medieval best describes the surroundings. The walls are stone covered with armor, spears and axes scattered around the perimeter. The chairs are Victorian and well cushioned.

Cathryn begins her meal with a bloody Caesar that she describes as perfect. I have a cold mug of beer. The menu has a tempting and very diversified selection of inexpensive appetizers. We decide on the chicken fingers, which are just as the menu promises—tender strips of chicken breast, breaded and deep-fried and served with rich plum sauce.

Prime rib is my companion's choice of entree—very juicy and tender and served with a baked potato. Fresh cooked vegetables are a la carte but worth the additional cost.

My selection of great crab legs is great—fresh meaty chunks of crab, drenched in butter and lemon, more than satisfy the heartiest of appetites.

Cathryn and I try a dish of ice cream and tea. This concludes a fine meal.

Adjoining the main dining room, the Corkscrew offers a large disco bar. Music here is modern, with a disc jockey in attendance. Being more contemporary or old style rock and roll fans, we found that after a couple of dances, we'd endured enough. So, goodnight to the Corkscrew Tavern, but thanks for a fine meal. 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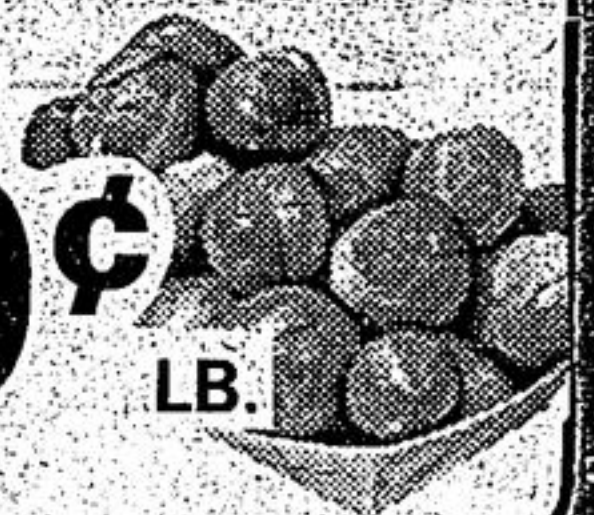
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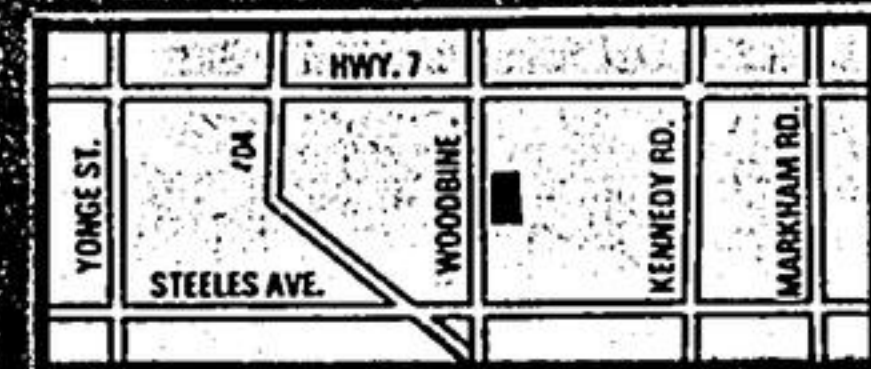
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
