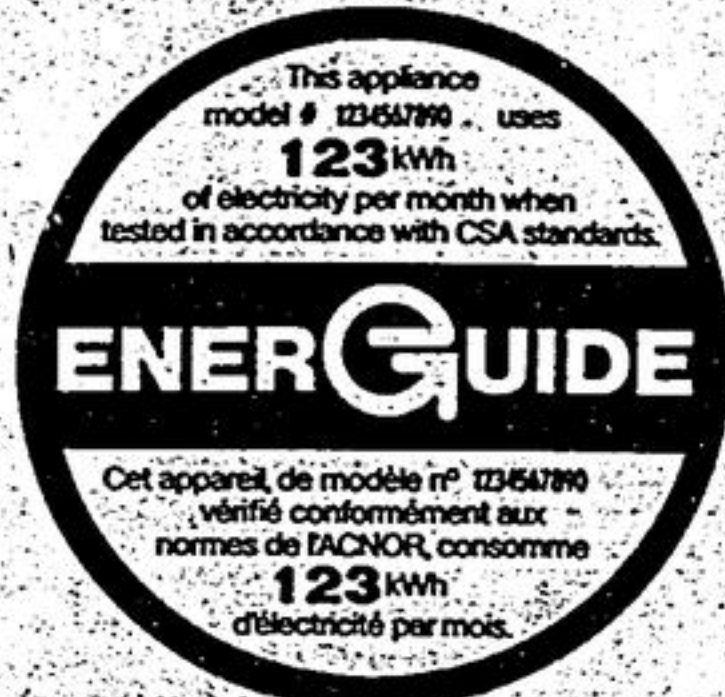
For several years, the Peck family was

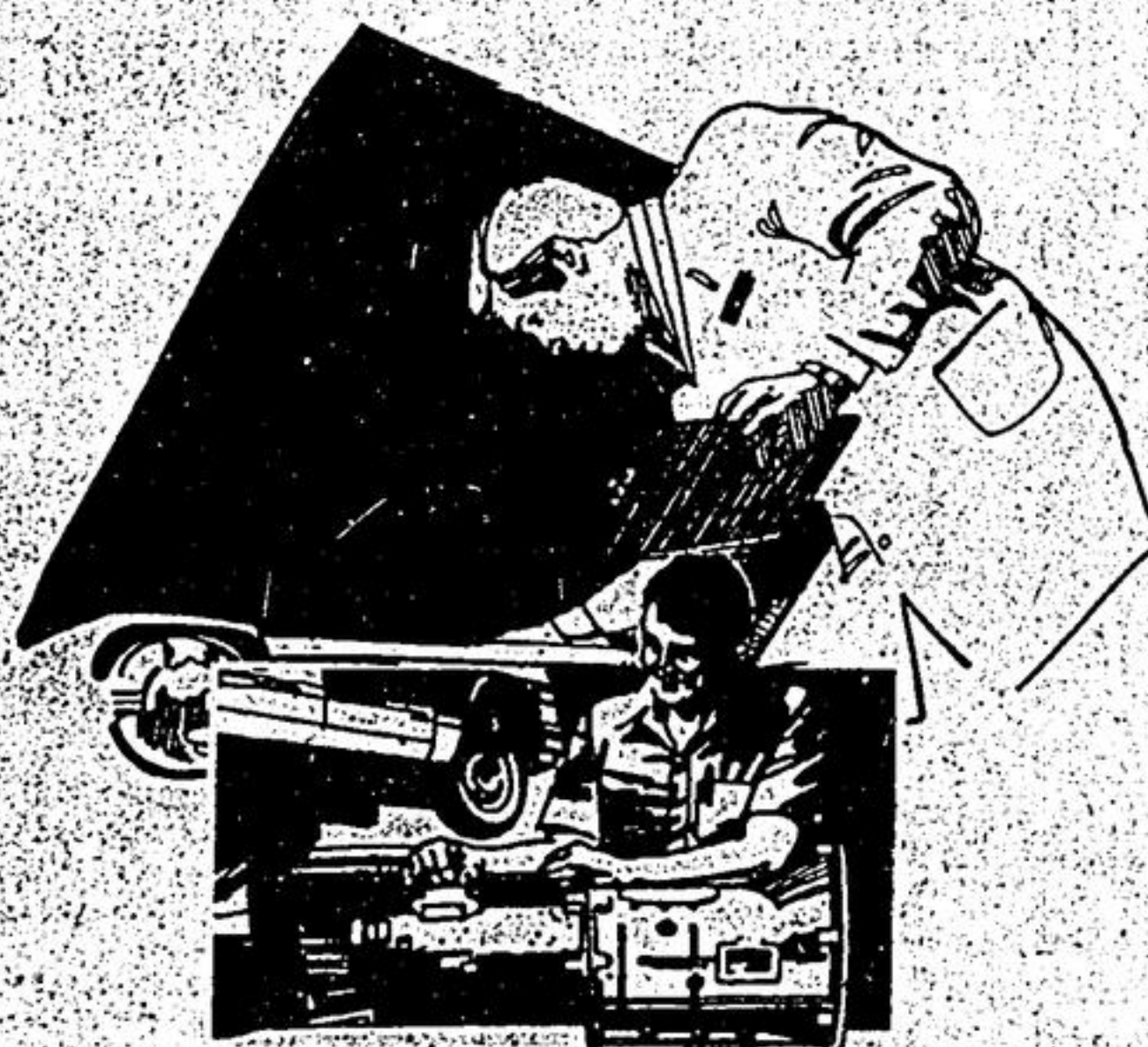
