Toll day hosted

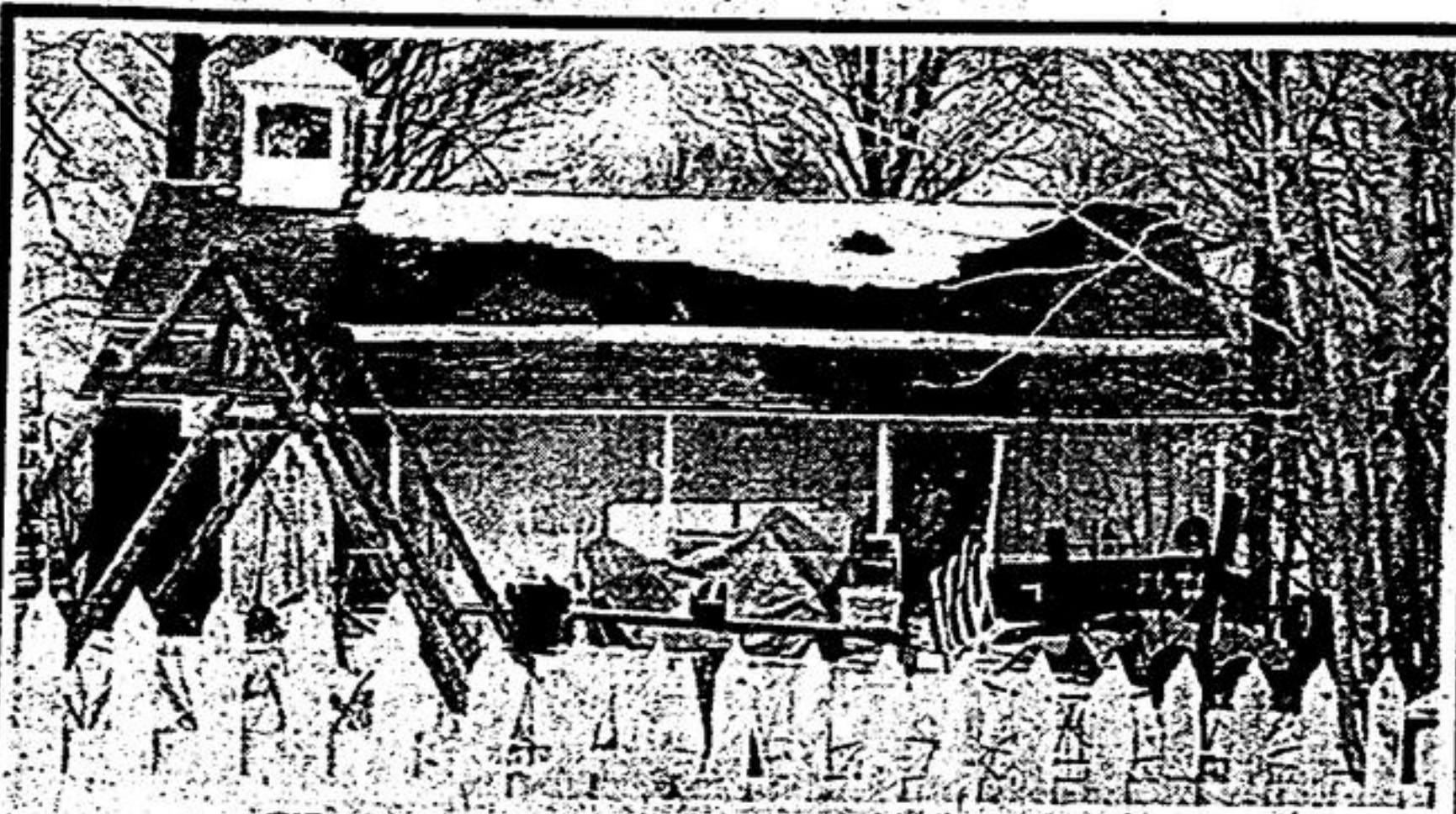

"There are many children who would like to have access to it," he stated.

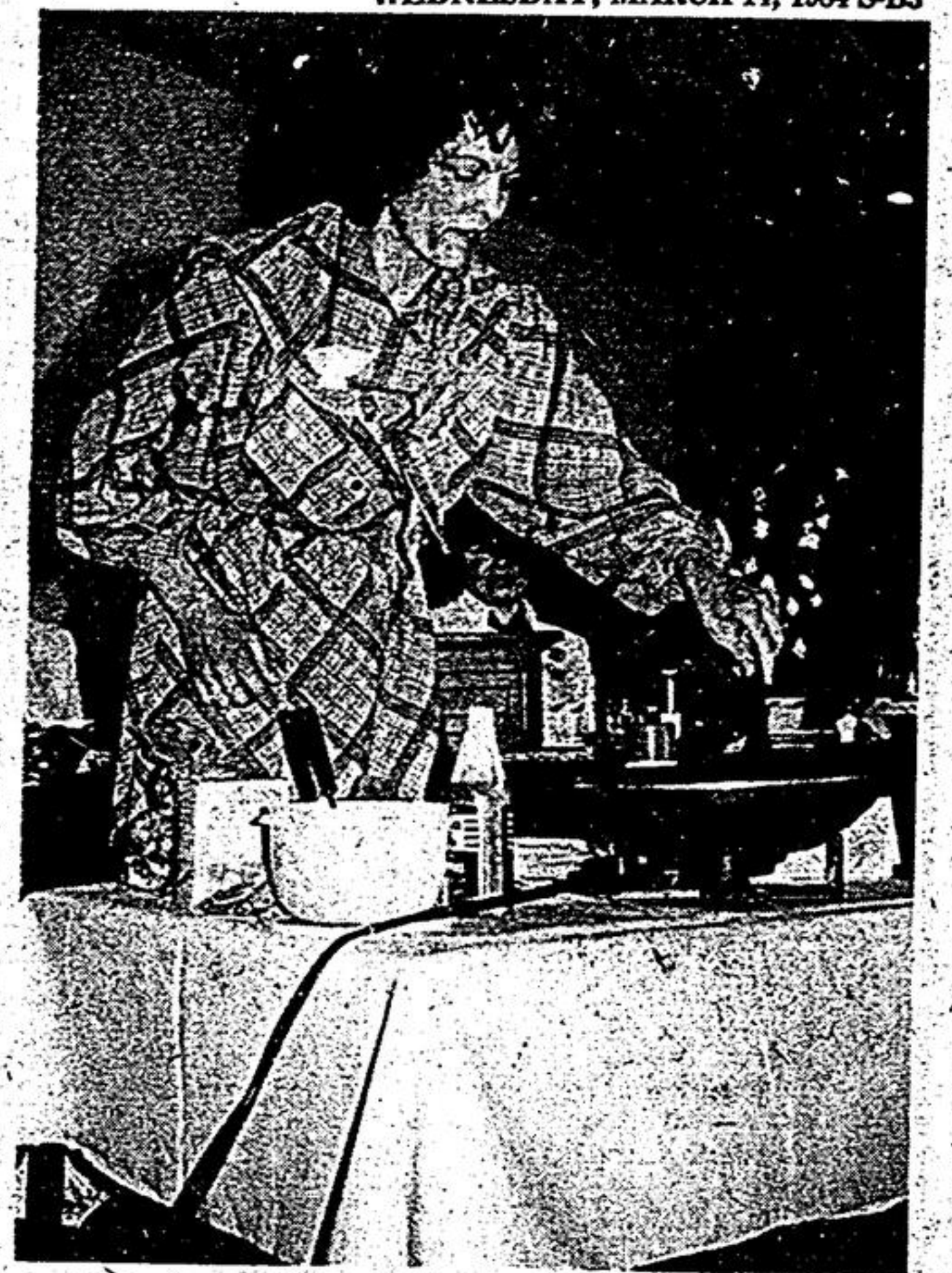

Committee requests addition grant

UXBRIDGE — The Uxbridge Works and Roads Committee agreed, Thursday, to apply for an additional \$100,000 grant from the Ministry of Transportation and Communications (MTC). The township is currently receiving \$358,000 from the MTC for road construction. The additional grant, if approved, will also be used for road construction.
