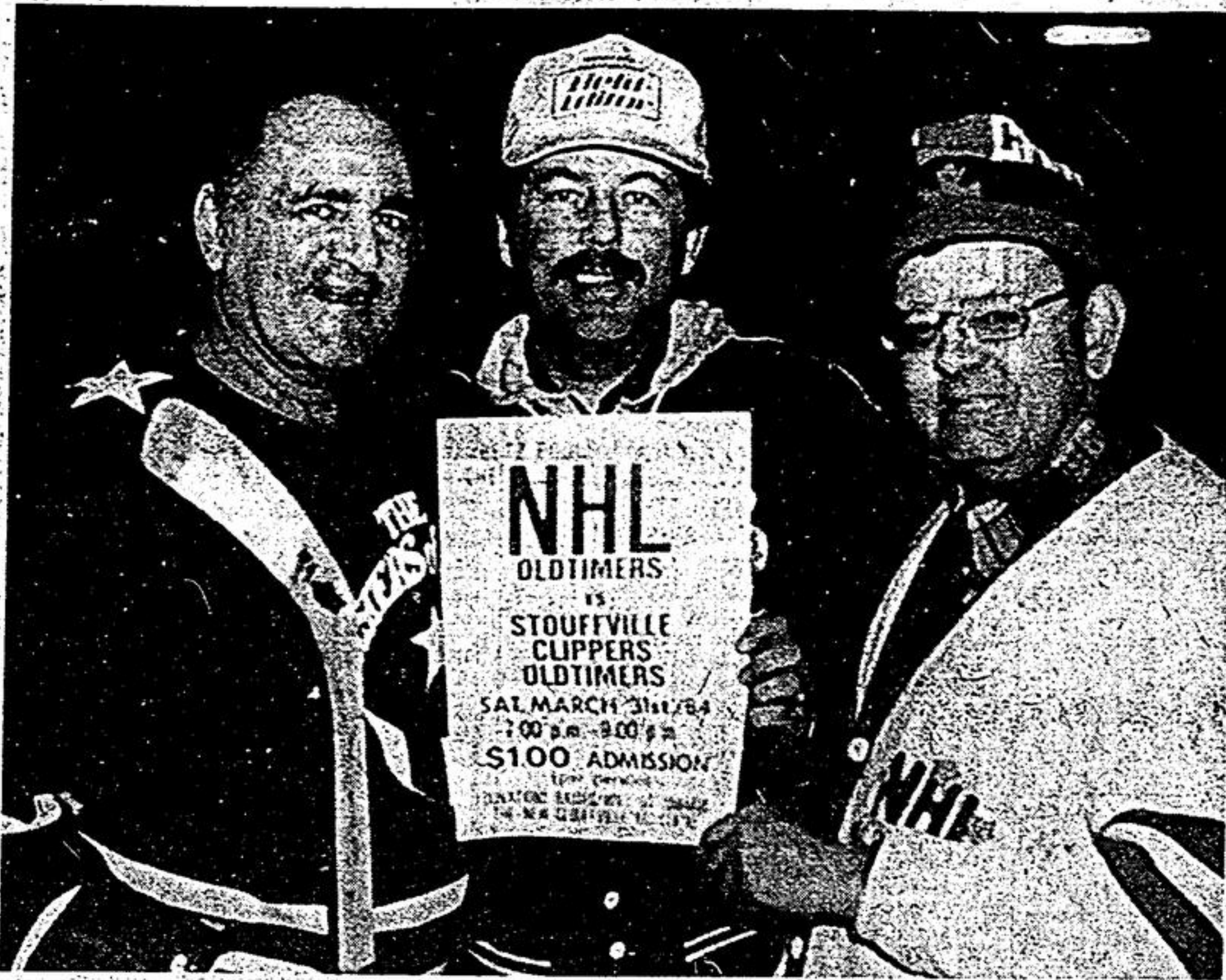


# Just like old times

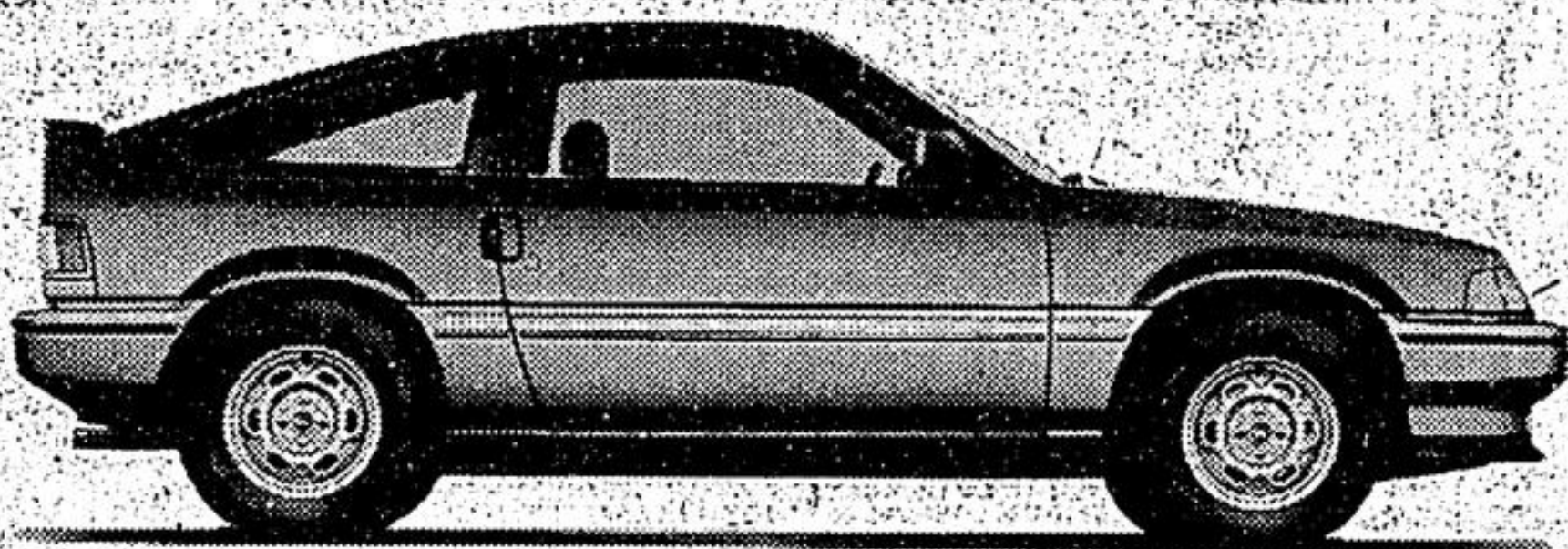

The final match was equally close as Monte Cristo squeezed out a 3-2 victory over Village Landscaping.

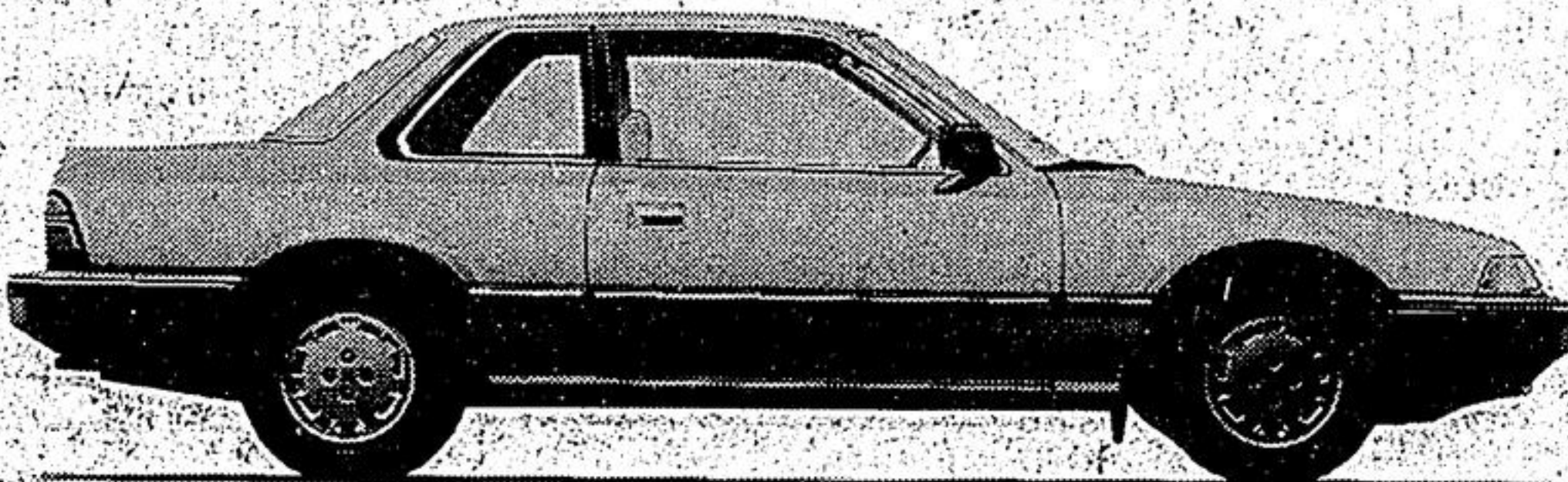

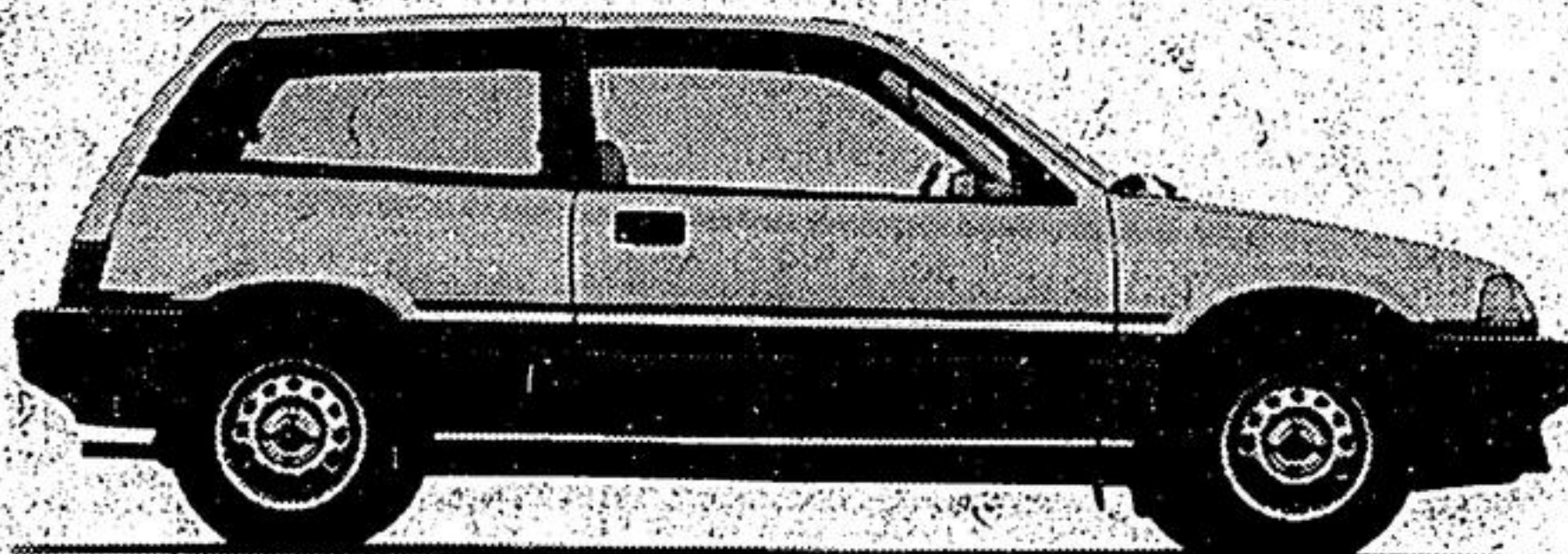
