Stouffville's Atom 'Clippers' sweep tourney championship

STOUFFVILLE — If at first you don't succeed, try again.

For three years, Stouffville has been sending a team to the Atom Hockey Tournament at Collingwood.

Last weekend, they won it all, a hard-fought championship against teams from Georgetown, Orangeville and Burlington. The Clippers shut out Burlington 4-0 to take the title.

In addition to this accomplishment, the Atom boys received a trophy for "Best On-Ice Appearance" during a parade of players, Saturday night.

All teams in Novice, Atom and Peewee Divisions, participated in the procession.

The Stouffville entry took the form of a Clipper ship with the boys walking inside. Hockey sticks protruded through portholes

and resembled oars. The mast was a Clipper banner. The ship, made of wood and painted maroon, was created by Cliff Glover. Judges agreed there was nothing quite like it in the show.

Two For Underwood
In the first game, Stouffville rolled over Georgetown by a score of 5-1. Jason Underwood was a two-goal marksman. Jay Scaife, Drae Glover and Brandon
