

# Buttonville to Pearson in six minutes

It's billed as Canada's shortest scheduled flight.

In about as much time as it takes to drink a cup of coffee, passengers are boarding a plane at Buttonville Airport and nesting down at Pearson International Airport just six minutes later.

"It's as cheap as the airport limousine," said Bruce Smith of Torontair, about the \$26 one-way flight. "And you miss all the bad weather and bumper to bumper traffic."

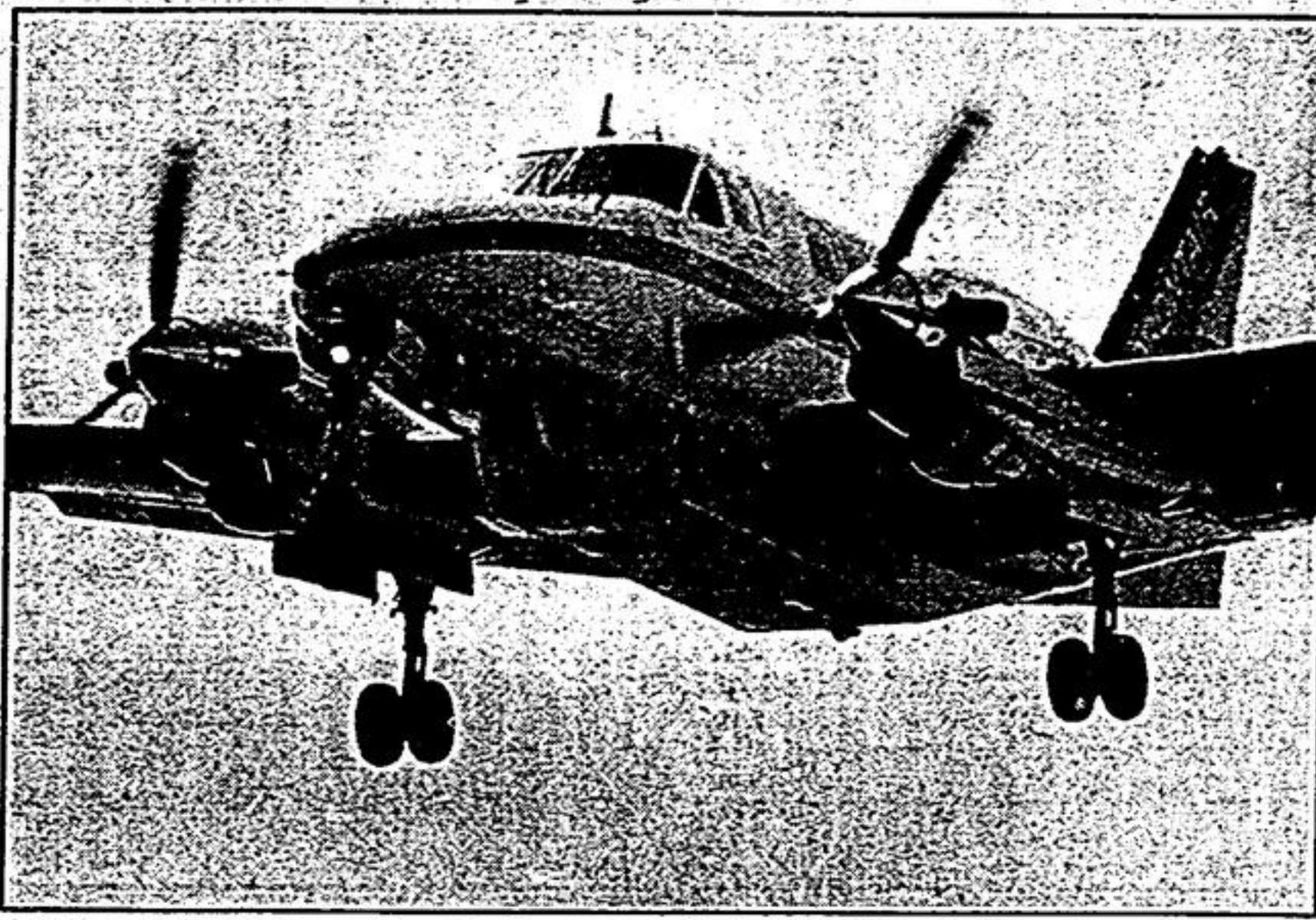
The six-minute flight, is just a touch-down point for the Beechcraft 99 turbo-prop plane that seats 14. From Pearson International, it will continue on to destinations Elliot Lake, or Kingston and Brockville.

Mr. Smith said there are three flights daily from Buttonville to Pearson, but added that there is no service on weekends. Flights leave at 6:35 a.m., 11:05 a.m. and 2:15 p.m. and return at 10:05 a.m., 1:50 p.m. and 9 p.m.

At present, the majority of people using the service are businessmen. To that end, Mr. Smith plans a large-scale promotion to interest corporations in the Markham and Richmond Hill area in taking a look at what Torontair has to offer.

But Mr. Smith also added that he would like to promote the idea with vacationers in this area as well. He said a selling point would be the terminal's free parking.

1st Instalment due - March 23rd, 1984  
2nd Instalment due - June 22nd, 1984

Interim tax bills have now been mailed. Rate-payers who have not received their bills should make immediate application to the Municipal Tax Department.

The PENALTY charged for non payment of 1984 taxes is one and one-quarter (1 1/4) percent imposed on the first day of default and on the first day of each month thereafter. Failure to receive a tax bill does not eliminate the responsibility for payment of taxes nor the penalty charges for late payment.
