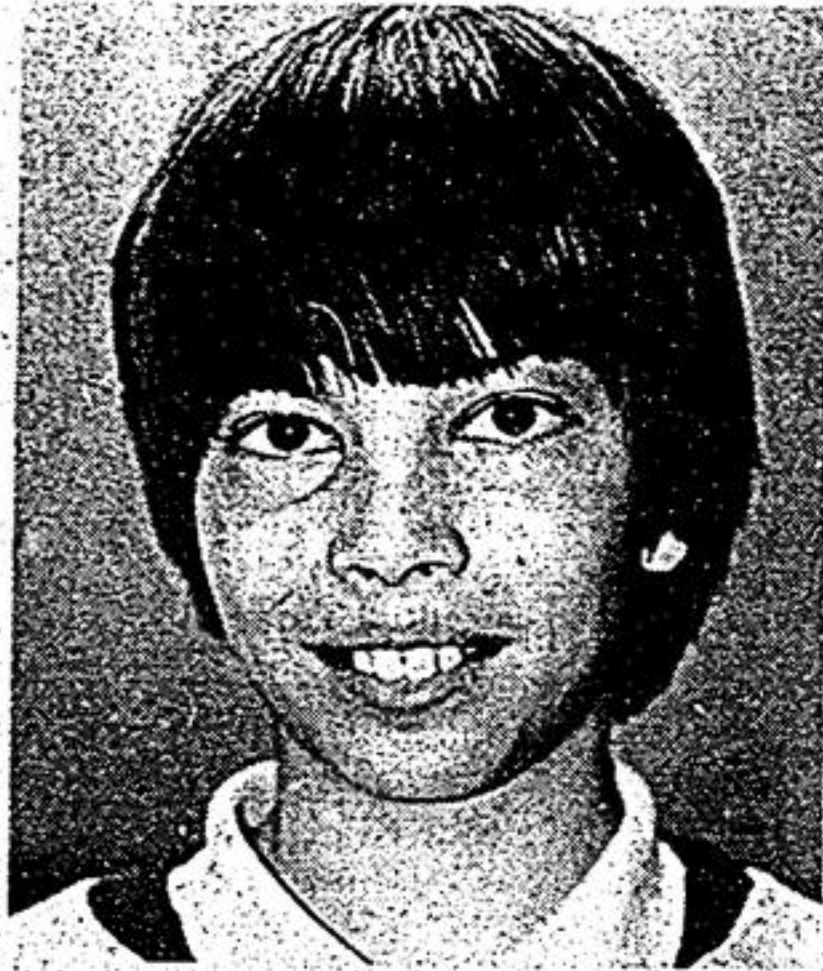

Town of Markham By-Law number 108-74 requires that all dogs in the municipality must be attached to a leash held by some person at all times when off the property of the owner.
Other municipal by-laws make it an offense to permit a dog to defecate on any highway or park property in the town.
