Wide open zoning

To The Editor:
With regard to your editorial concerning the rezoning of the Adams' property at Main and Albert Streets, under the heading "The Correct Decision", May 2, I wish to make reply.

The objection, clearly stated by local residents, is not to Mrs Adams' building plan but to the proposed zoning change to General Commercial without restrictions.

If this happens, the property may become the site of a convenience store which could stay open late every night or yet another fast food outlet, or practically anything else. This is the basis of the objection.

This will lower residential property values on older Stouffville-homes which are of historic interest and which contribute to the image of the town. Do you seriously believe these homes will be maintained once that image is further eroded? And once property values drop?

When the image of "peaceful, pretty, old Ontario town" is lost, it will be gone forever. Is that what you want for Stouffville Main Street?
