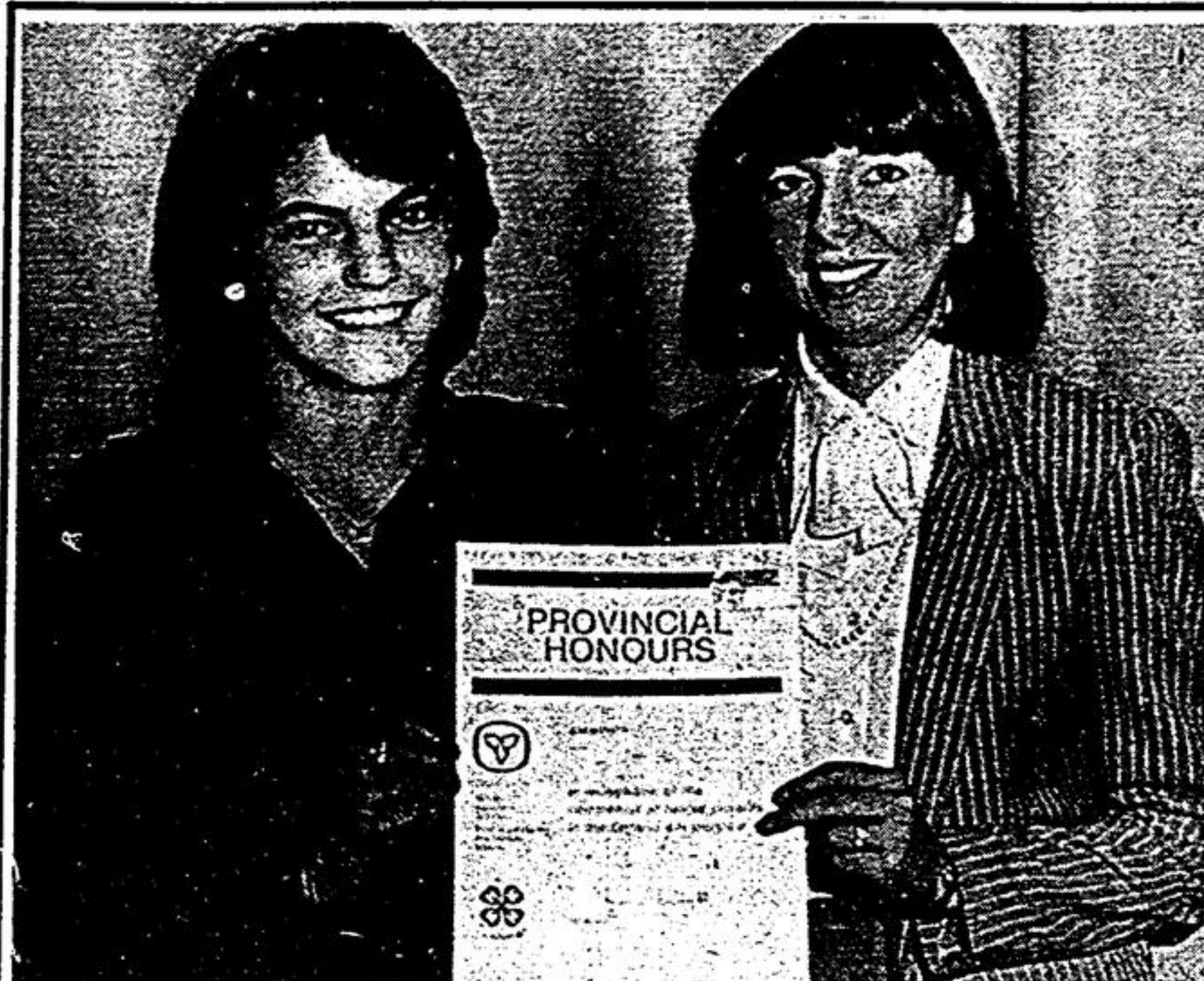

The Official Tree of Ontario The White Pine

During the Bi-Centennial Celebrations for the Province of Ontario, one particular species of tree will gain "celebrity status". The tree slated for recognition is the White Pine, known scientifically as Pinus Strobus.

White Pine, which grows naturally in most populated areas of Ontario has a special historical significance. Since 1784, economic expansion and social development has resulted from the province's vast forests and the resourcefulness of people to use them. The British Royal Navy made ship masts from white pine and the export of pine lumber from Ontario was a major source of income during the province's early years. Settlers used white pine extensively for shelter, furniture, tools etc. Since then, it has continued to be used as a preferred forest product and is admired as a distinctive part of the Ontario landscape. The forest industry has played a major role in the growth of the province. Today, 1 in 10 jobs is related to the forest industry.

Lansing Buildall is proud of its association with the province of Ontario and the forest industry. In recognition of our association we celebrate the Bi-Centennial and selection of the White Pine as our provincial tree during National Forest Week.

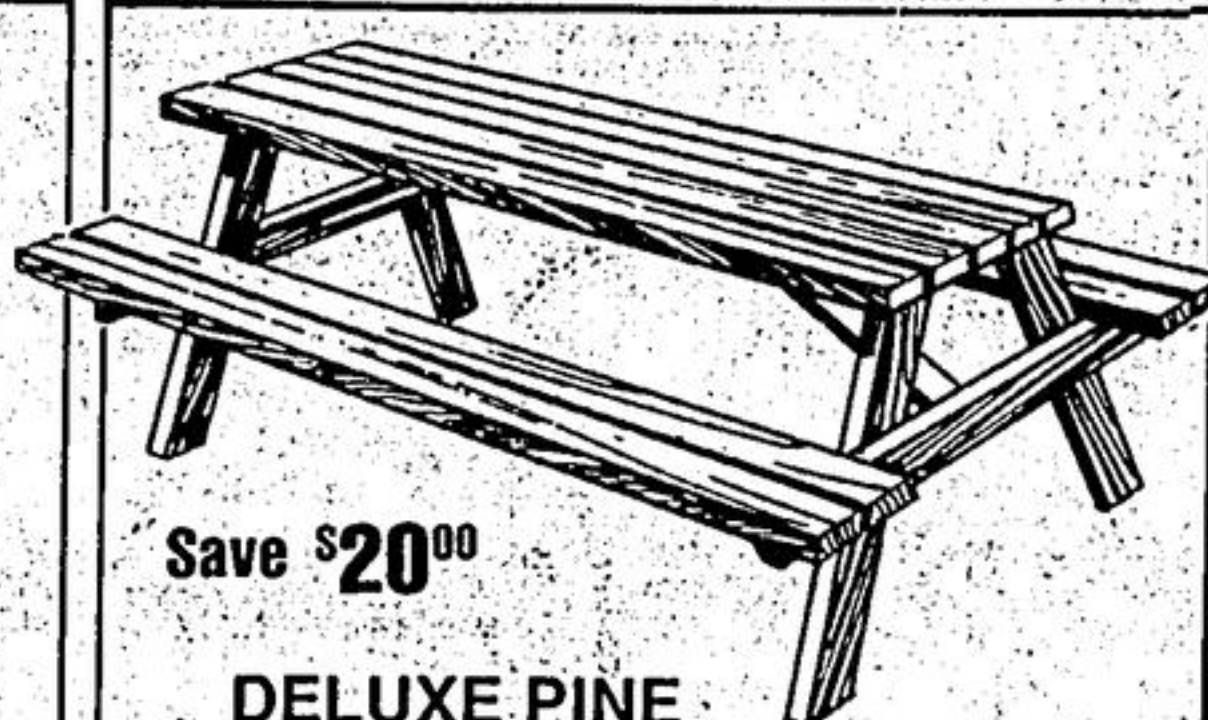

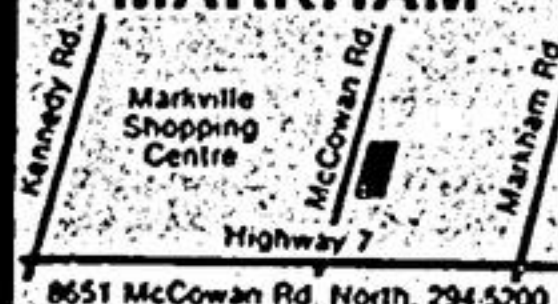

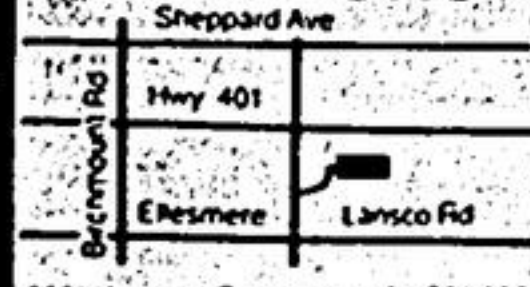
