Late Mary Lauterbach

Talented artist

GOODWOOD — Mary Elizabeth Lauterbach leaves many lasting memorials. Her free spirit and love of life are reflected in the many beautiful paintings prominently displayed in the family residence, Conc. 2, Uxbridge and her parents' home, Lloyd Avenue, Stouffville.

Mrs. Lauterbach, the former Mary Elizabeth Beaven, died suddenly April 13. She was only 40.

Born in Toronto, Mary attended John Fisher and Finch Avenue Public Schools before graduating to Earl Haig Collegiate. In 1961, she was selected the school's college queen.

After high school, she held positions with I.B.M. and Imperial Oil. She and her husband moved to R.R. 3, Stouffville following their marriage, June 6, 1970. Their lovely home, they built and furnished themselves.

Mrs. Lauterbach had many interests. She had enrolled in a brush-painting course at the Japanese Cultural Centre, Don Mills

and became extremely skilled at this art. The creation of dried flowers was another of her talents. She enjoyed music, playing bridge, crocheting and writing poetry. One of her poems was read at the funeral service, April 17, conducted by Rev. Edith Ann McManiman from the O'Neill Chapel, Stouffville. Interment was at Goodwood Cemetery.

Mary had an intense love for her home and family. She seldom missed a ball game involving daughters Jessica and Anne-Liese. Besides her husband Guenter and children, she is survived by her parents, Erni and Evelyn Beaven of Stouffville; a brother John at Bobcaygeon and a sister Susan Winn of Goodwood.

"Everybody's friend," were the words used by Rev. McManiman to describe Mrs. Lauterbach's associations within the community.
