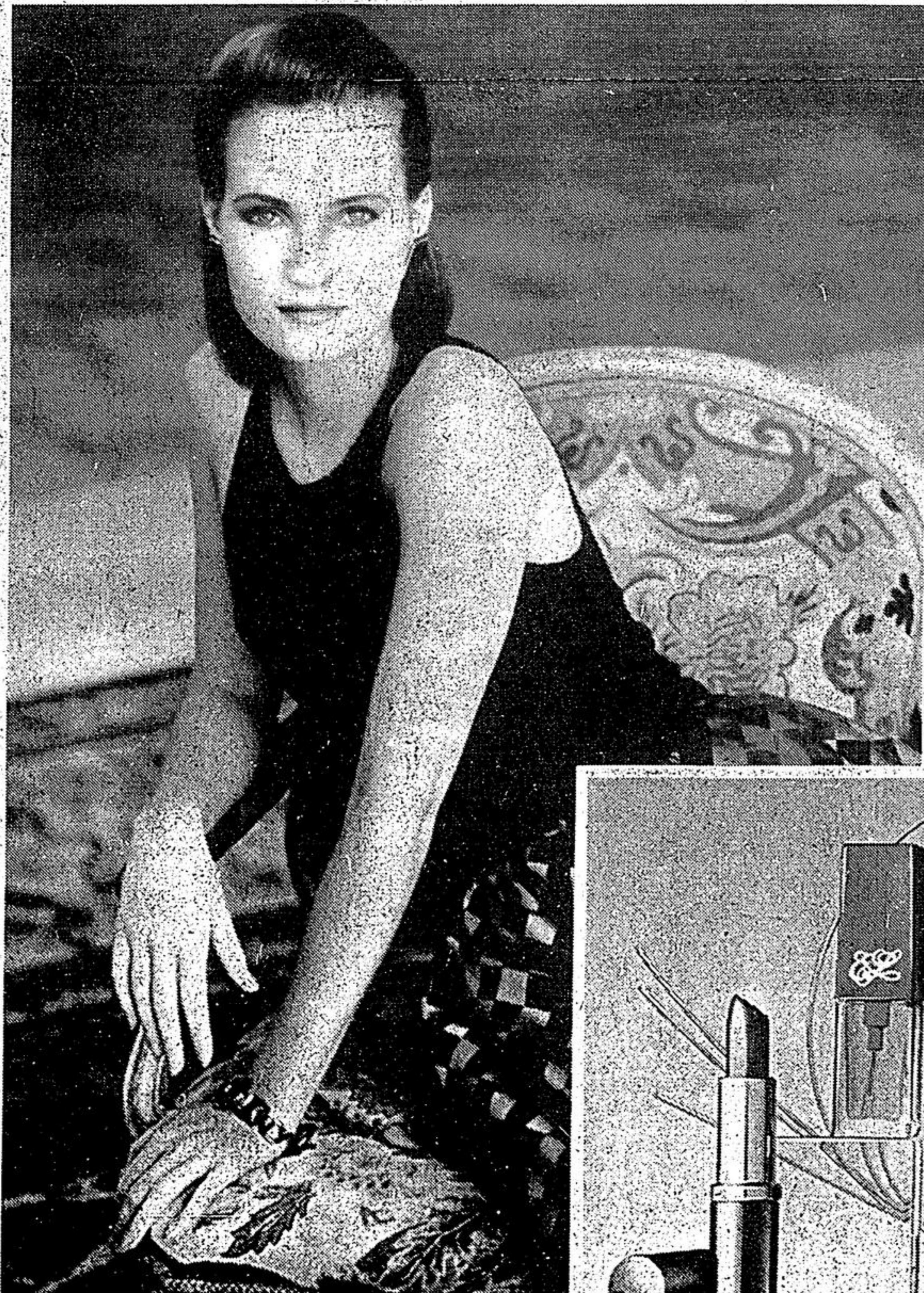
## Gardening main topic

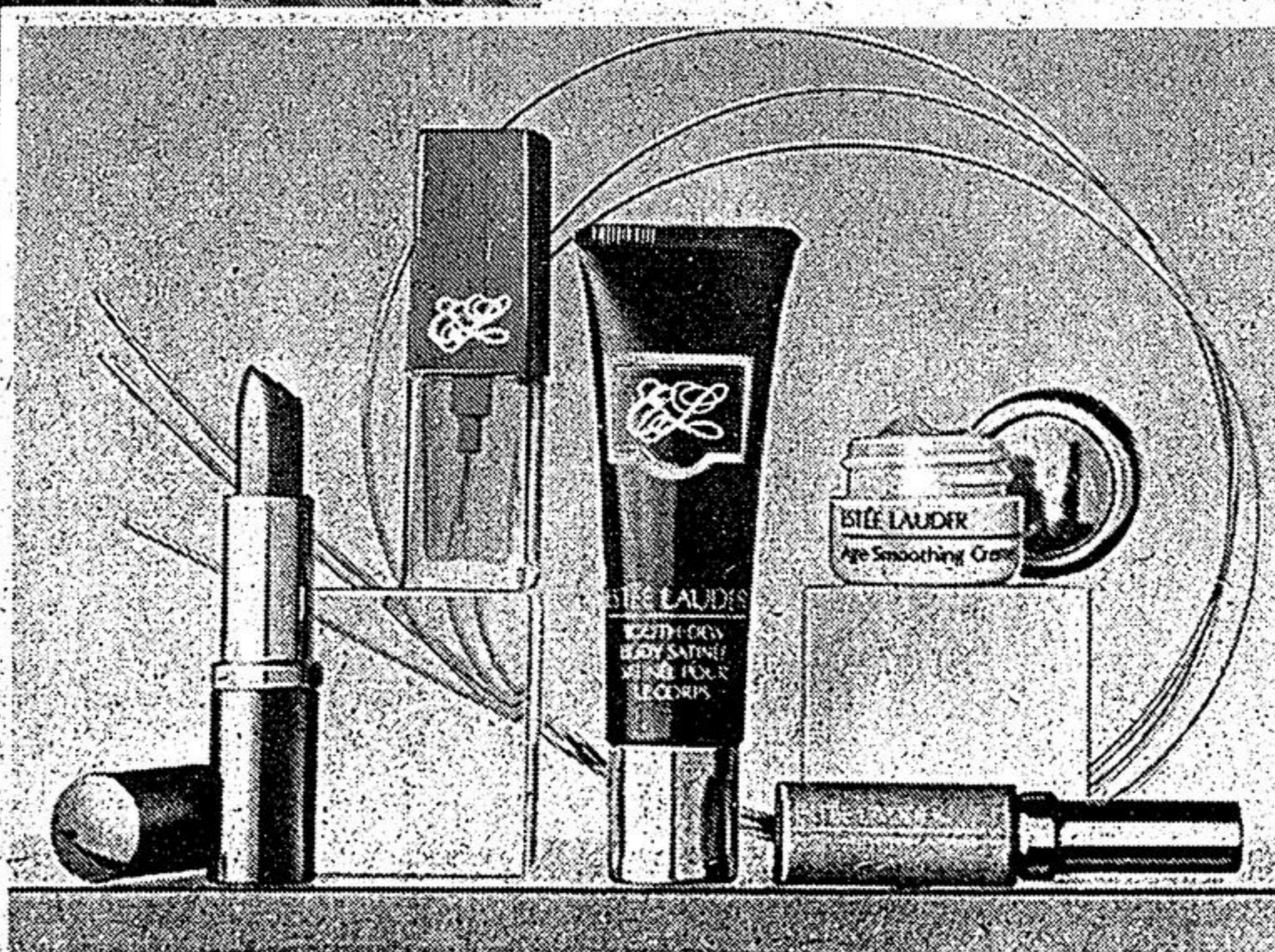
