New priests ordained at Markham church

An overflow congregation filled Grace Anglican Church for an ordination recently.

Anglicans from both the Markham area as well as Barrie were present as York-Simcoe Area Bishop, Rt. Rev. Arthur Brown ordained Rev. David Franks of Grace Church and Rev. Joan Waters of Trinity Anglican Church, Barrie, as priests.

Music for the service was provided by Dr. Edward Anderson, Grace Church organist and the church choir. Jan Cumming of Barrie provided the organ prelude.

Clergy from all parts of York-Simcoe were present to observe and participate in the event. Among them was Canon Bob Grisdale of Holy Trinity Church, Thornhill, who was Bishop's Chaplain.

The bulletin service was observed by the congregation, some of whom hadn't seen an ordination before.

Bishop Brown welcomed the congregation to the service before leading the event.

Bart Waters (husband of Mrs. Waters) read the Old Testament Lesson before Rev. Al Chaffee, Rector of Oak Ridges read the New Testament Lesson. Canon John Speers, Rector of Trinity Church, Barrie, read the Gospel from the congregation.

Dr. Alan Hayes, a professor of Wycliffe College, Toronto, preached the sermon. The speaker asked the question, "if lay people are doing more things in the church today, why do we need clergy?"

Mr. Hayes listed the things the laity do today in the Anglican Church like reading lessons, leading some services, participating in synods, visiting the sick and at times preaching.

He answered the question saying that ministers, "are commissioned for a special task." Speaking of the clergy he continued saying they are, "the body of the Church who bring goodings or the Gospel to the afflicted. They also perform the Sacraments: A lay person cannot consecrate communion or absolve a person of sin."

"Turning to the thought of ministers, Alan Hayes said, 'our work is not done when we have done the work of the church. We also have to care for the sick and needy.' (He took the part of a minister in this case.)"

Speaking of a minister and their role, he said, "they are servants ministering to the church and the world. Ordination is an orderly way to publicly show these people are ready to minister. A priest is a symbol. They are symbolized as the successor of the Lord and symbolize the church."

"Thinking of the two ministers awaiting ordination, Prof. Hayes spoke of them.

"From today on, Joan and David are anointed to be symbols of the church. Ordination is a double edged sword. They will function with us but will also suffer and have to work hard for the Lord. We give thanks in the Litany that God has raised up clergy like Joan and David," he said in conclusion.

Following the sermon the two candidates were presented to the Bishop who was asked to ordain them. When they had

A. That part of the Community of Stouffville lying west of the C.N.R. right-of-way may use a hose for watering lawns and gardens between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. ONLY on even numbered calendar days.

B. That part of the Community of Stouffville lying east of the C.N.R. right-of-way may use a hose for watering lawns and gardens between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. ONLY on odd numbered calendar days.
