

Mother's aids new hospital

Despite a little water leaking through the roof due to some pre-opening construction problems, it didn't stop more than 350 guests of the new Mother's Restaurant in Markham from raising \$1,136 for the Markham Stouffville Hospital Fund.

Mother's, which officially opened yesterday, used Sunday as a training session for the staff. Invitations were sent out to various members of the community asking them to attend, select a meal, and contribute at least half of the menu price of the food to the hospital fund.

Markham's Century 21-Armour Real Estate Inc., has added a new twist to selling homes.

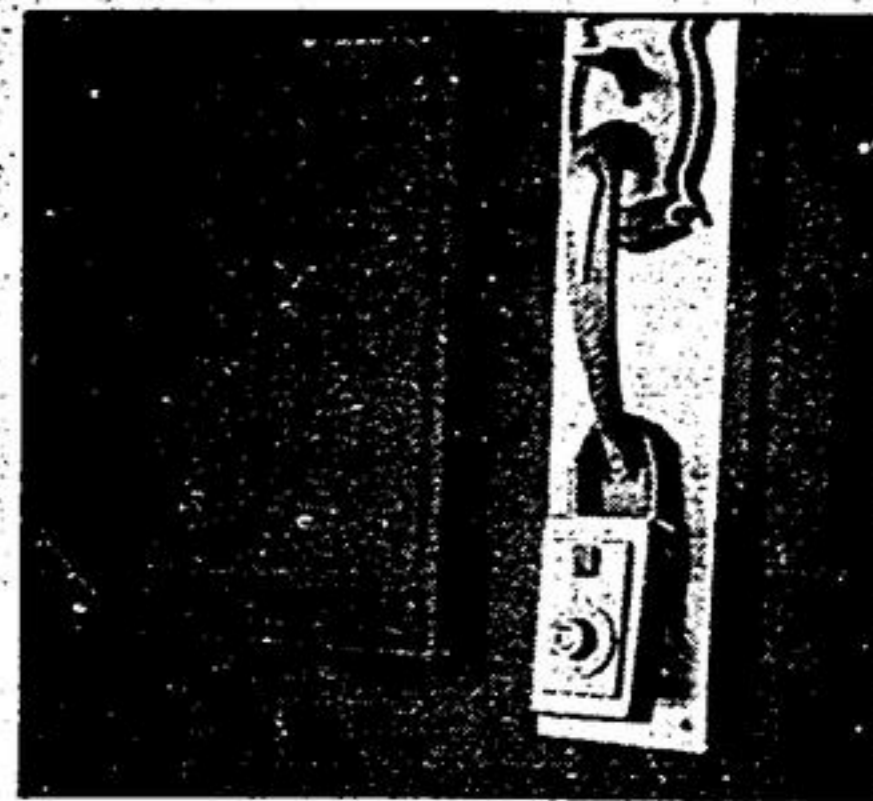
Manager Brien East, calls it his 'Gold Box' idea. The Gold Box or 'key safe' is a strong, small, metal container large enough to hold the key to the front door on houses listed for sale on the M.L.S. system.

Resembling a giant, hollow padlock, it hangs around the doorknob and secures the spare copy of the homeowner's front door key.

Temptation to leave the door key 'under the mat' or 'in the mailbox' for the next salesman's appointment is eliminated. So is the need to duplicate door keys.

Positive identification is made through a telephone call-back system to allow associate Real Estate salespeople the current combination to the Gold Box and thus the door key.

Mr. East says his company is determined to respond to homeowner's needs for proper door key security and at the same time ensure that his salespeople allow the exposure necessary to sell a house.



This gold box attached to the door means only accredited real estate agents will have access to showing a home when the owners are out. The safeguard eliminates leaving the key under the mat or in the mailbox for the next sales agent.

TOWN OF WHITCHURCH-STOUFFVILLE NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS TO DESTROY WEEDS

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to all persons in possession of land in accordance with the Weed Control Act, Ontario, that unless the noxious weeds or weed seeds growing on their lands within the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville are destroyed by Friday, June 15th, 1984, and throughout the season as often as it is necessary to prevent the ripening of their seeds and dispersal of their pollen, the Council of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville has appointed a Weed Inspector to cause said weeds or weed seeds to be destroyed in such manner as he may deem proper, and that the expenses incurred by the said Weed Inspector in the discharge of his duties shall be placed on the Collector's Roll of the Municipality against the respective lands concerned and that such amounts shall be collected in the same manner as taxes.

Although Dandelions, Burdock and Goldenrod are not considered noxious weeds within the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville under the Weed Control Act, the co-operation of all citizens is solicited in the elimination of these nuisance weeds. The co-operation of all persons concerned is earnestly solicited.
