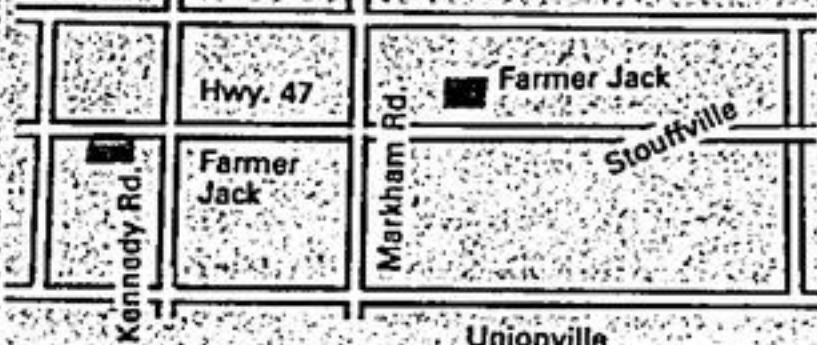

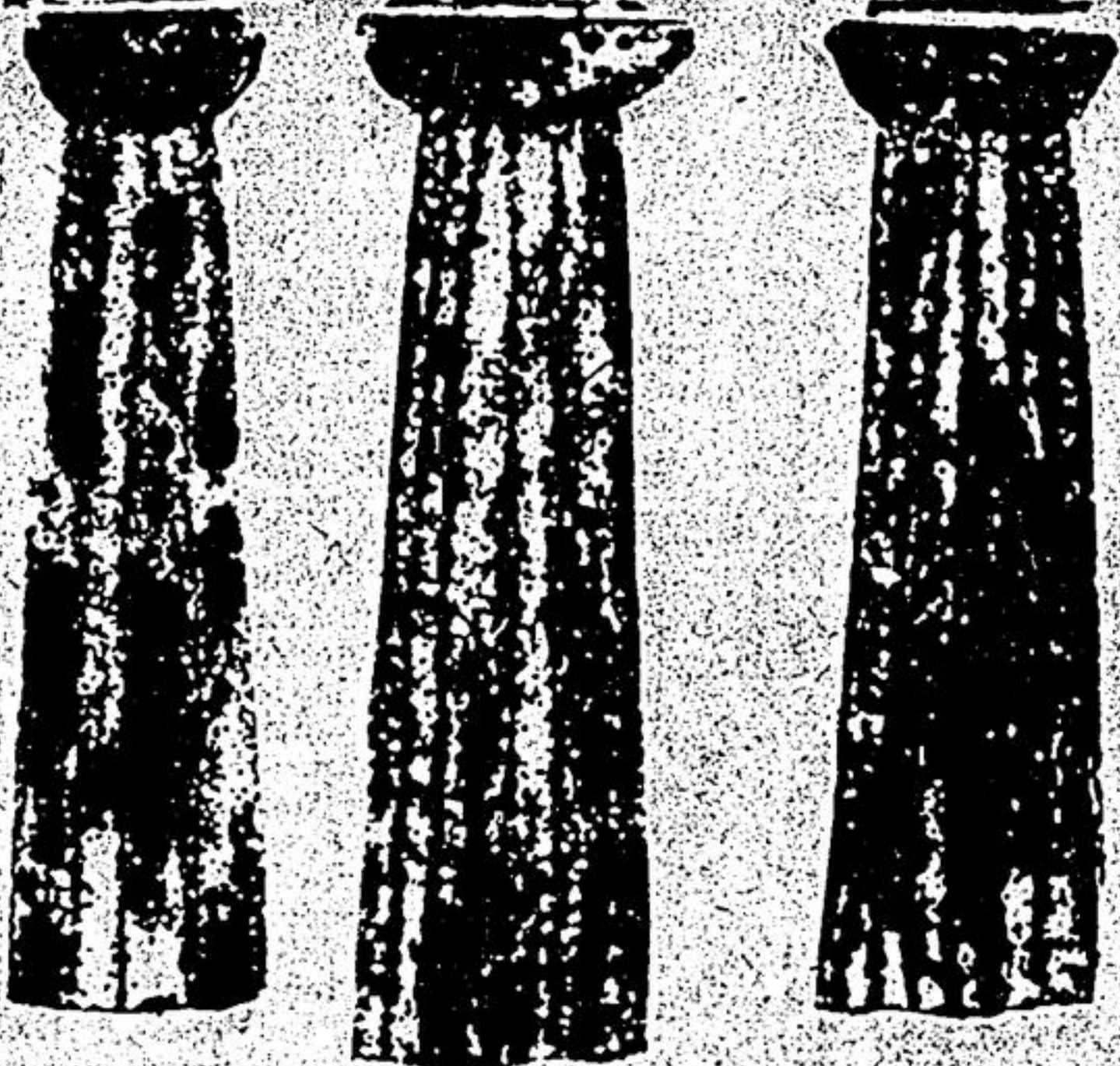

### BARBECUING

- Steaks should be 1-2" (2.5-5 cm) thick. Trim excess fat off outer edge, but leave enough for protection while cooking.
- Slash fat edges to prevent curling.
- Grass the grill lightly to prevent sticking.
- Place steaks on grill and barbecue 3-5" (8-12 cm) from the coals. Grill about 2-3 minutes per side for medium-done 1" (2.5 cm) steaks and about 15-20 minutes per side for medium-done 2" (5 cm) steaks. Turn only once.
- Salt steaks after cooking to prevent loss of moisture.
- Use long-handled tongs rather than a fork for turning meat, to prevent piercing.
- Test meat for doneness at the minimum recommended cooking time by making a small cut at the center of the meat or near the bone.
- When barbecuing kabobs, skewer long skewers and leave space between food for heat penetration.
- Meat may be basted during all or part of the cooking with your favourite barbecue sauce or marinade. If the sauce contains much sugar or ingredients that burn easily, apply only during latter part of cooking.
