WHITBY — Cullen Gardens and Miniature Village will celebrate its fifth annual Rose Festival from June 29 through to July 8. The facility, located on Taunton Road in Whitby, just west of Hwy 12, is

paying tribute to the world's favorite flower as 2,500 Hybrid Teas, Grandifloras and Miniatures come into bloom in a vast array of color. The magnificent garden surrounds a
