We are extremely fortunate to live in an area that, while relatively close to Toronto, remains blessed with open fields, neighborly attitudes and superb restaurants.

On Thursday night, I attended a reception at the Hobby Horse Arms in Uxbridge. Due to a previous commitment, Cathryn was unable to be present. Because this is one of her favorite eating-out spots, she definitely will return.

My hosts, Ron and Rita Tindley, invited a very diverse yet compatible group. Object of this reception was to introduce their new chef, Imre Flinta who should provide expertise and flair to an already good eating establishment.

Fresh meats, grapes, pate and wine proved just right for this particular gathering. ## Camille Bramwell Handiwork expert

STOUFFVILLE — Service was held Aug. 14 from St. Mark's Catholic Church, Stouffville, for Mrs. Peter Bramwell following her passing, Aug. 12, in Scarborough Centenary Hospital. She'd been a patient there since suffering a broken hip in a fall at her home one week before. She would have marked her 94th birthday, Aug. 27.

Mrs. Bramwell, the former Camille Thomas, was born in Boulogne, France and came to Canada at age eighteen.

Prior to moving to a home on the east side of Hwy. 47 in 1957, Mr and Mrs Bramwell resided in Stouffville on what is now the site of the Cable Tech Wire Co. Limited plant. Mr Bramwell predeceased his wife in 1967.

Mrs. Bramwell enjoyed handiwork. Signs of her skill are visible everywhere. One item, a beautifully embroidered tablecloth, once won a first prize at the Canadian National Exhibition.

While failing eyesight curtailed this activity, she continued to busy herself around the house, assisted by Betty Taylor from R.R. 2, Claremont, a home-helper she regarded affectionately as a "daughter".

Surviving is one son, Peter, R.R. 3, Stouffville and a sister, Yvonne in Paris, France.

Father James Adams conducted the funeral service with interment, Stouffville Cemetery. The pall-bearers were—Ken Roberts, Lloyd Johnson, Denis O'Connor, Ted Barry, Charles Ireton and Gordon Minton.
