Triples came from Paul Sheppard and Tod Little. Jason Smirnits supplied steady pitching that seemed to improve as the pressure increased. Markham had to win Monday night's third game in Richvale to stay alive. But although it held a slim 4-3 lead after three innings, Richvale came on to grab a 9-4 victory.

Stover led the Markham offence again, this time with a single and a two-run homer. John Graham contributed an RBI double, while singles went to Wooley and Little.

Markham finished its regular season with a 7-7 record, good for sixth place in the nine-team loop.
