UXBRIDGE — The end of summer is a sure sign that it's almost fair time again. The 120th annual class 'B' Uxbridge Agricultural Society Fair will be held Sept. 7, 8 and 9 at Elgin Park.

Activities get underway a week Friday when the midway and fair building open at 5 p.m. An official ceremony will be held at 8 p.m., followed by a fiddling contest.

Saturday, Sept. 8, will be a busy day with most venues in full swing. There will be a variety of shows including 4-H dairy and cattle judging.

A highlight Saturday will be the kiddies tractor pull, where young competitors ride miniature models of the real thing. There will be a total of nine mini machines and two sleds involved in this fun event organized by the Fair Board.

Sunday's schedule of events includes a Morgan Horse Show at 9:30 a.m. as well as heavy horse pulls and a beef show later in the day. Buildings close at 4 p.m.

Fair-goers should take note of a number of changes in the program, including: (1) Primary Class - No. 5 - should read: Slogan button collection displayed in an original fashion. Max. 20 buttons.

(2) Marlene Webb Ceramic Special - should read: No. 35 - Any glazed item - using precast greenware (ages 12 and under); No. 36 - Any glazed item - using precast greenware (ages 13-16); No. 37 - Any stained item - using precast greenware (ages 12 and under); No. 38 Any stained item - using precast greenware (ages 13-16).

(3) Uxbridge Model Club Special - should read: No. 44 - Ages 11 and over - any model from a kit - displayed on 12" (30 cm) corrugated cardboard.

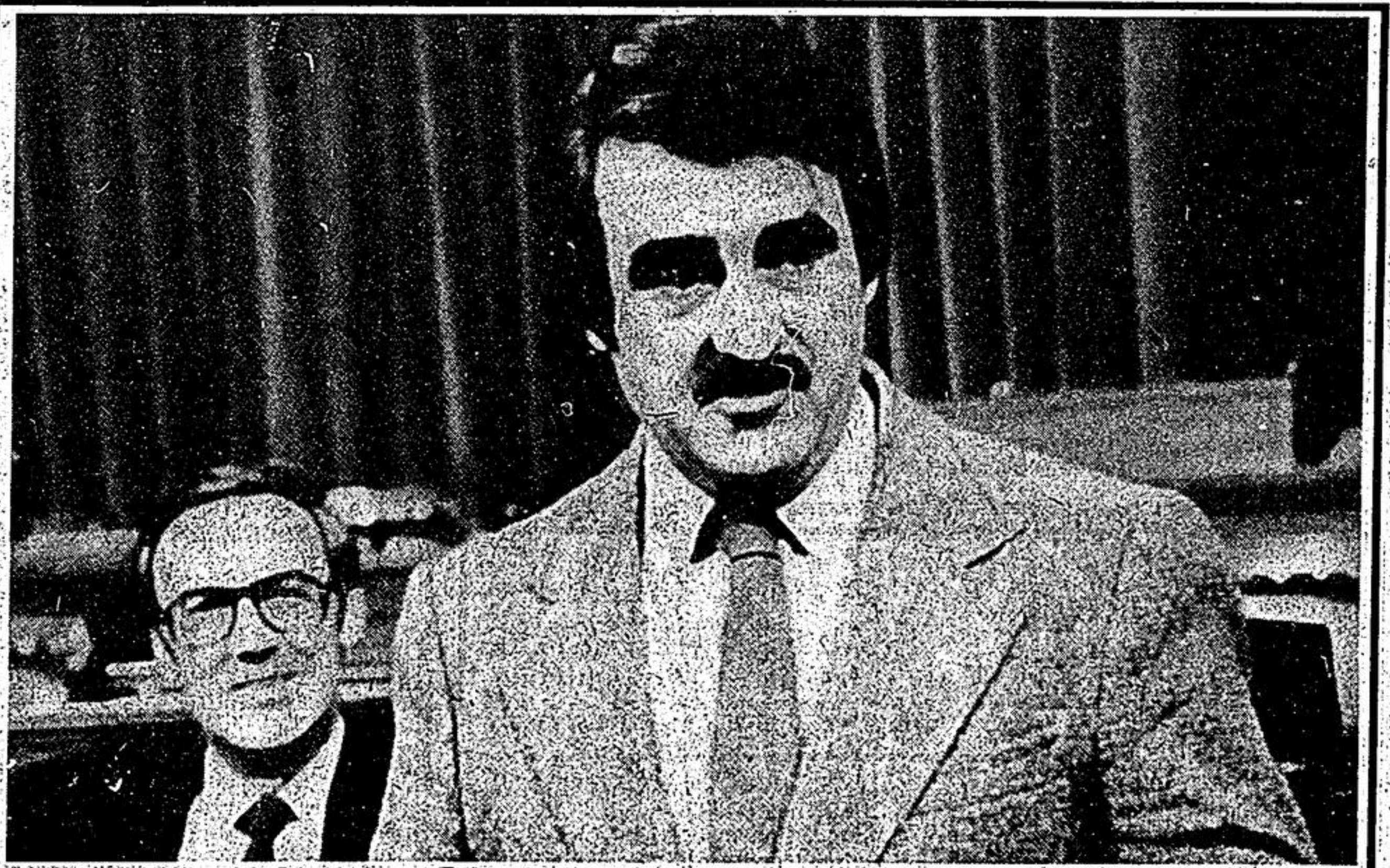

Therefore, in order to allow time for the newsletter to reach all residents of Pickering, registrations for programmes will not be processed until ten (10) days after the newsletters are given to the Post Office.

To ensure a fair opportunity for all residents to take part in the recreation programme of their choice, mailed-in registrations will be processed first, and walk-in registrations will not be accepted for the first two days of the registration period. Therefore, the following days will constitute the "Fall" registration schedule.

WALK-IN REGISTRATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED ON TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 4th, 1984
