**Variety abounds for spring bulbs**

We're well acquainted with ever popular tulips and daffodils as harbingers of spring. To keep us mindful of the approaching demise of bleak days our winter weary spirits welcome their cheeriness on the breakfast table as cut flowers. We revel in their harmonious colors.  
But we can add to our pleasures by becoming familiar with additional worthwhile and reliable bulbs that herald warmer weather ahead, too. Snowdrops, Crocuses, Scillas, Hyacinths, Spanish Bluebells and Muscari (the latter, Grape Hyacinths, were also called Starch Lillies because starch from their bulbs was at one time used to stiffen linen) are just a few that bring gusto to reawakening earth.

**Green 'n' Growing**

Bulbs look pleasing under trees, peeping from rocky pockets, in front of an evergreen foliage background, beneath groundcovers, around fences or patios, between paving stones, clustered in intimate gardens, edging borders or along entranceways for a sea of blooms.  
Avoid discolored or wrinkled bulbs and choose instead large, fat and firm ones. Keep those temporarily awaiting planting in a dark, airy, cool place. (Don't forget to hold some aside to force indoors for a kaleidoscope of winter color.)  
Bulbs are part of our permanent landscaping as the soil should be fertile and well-drained (to prevent rotting) in areas of sun or partial shade away from drying winds where other bulbs haven't been for a few years.

Mix in a handful of bone meal per sq. ft. and place varieties at their correct depth with pointed ends up. Think masses of color and plant generously - smaller ones closely in clumps of 24 or more, the larger bulbs in clusters of 12 - and set all the same types and hues together to produce the fullest impact. Sprinkle a little fertilizer on the earth, water well and in late fall a few inches of mulch over the soil would be helpful.  
When new growth emerges gently rake in fertilizer. Remove faded blooms but leave the foliage to wither naturally. This is vital as it provides nutrients to fatten the bulbs. Removal before maturing has a weakening effect and will surely prevent normal flowering the next year.  
Ripening is completed when the limp, yellowish leaves come away with a mild pull. The unsightly foliage can be camouflaged among concealer perennials like Peonies or Bleeding Hearts or overlaid with shallow rooted spreading annuals like Petunias.

Memory is often unreliable, so it's behooving to not only mark areas with sticks so bulbs aren't inadvertently disturbed during cleanup, but to jot down colors and full names for future reference.  
They give exterior decorating sought after touches of vitality long before other plants don their green garments. Go ahead, conjure a spring garden and make a statement. Now's the time to do it!  
**HELPFUL HINTS:**  
Autumn Crocus, Amaryllis, Daffodil, Hyacinth and Narcissus bulbs should be kept safely away from youngsters and pets as they're harmful if ingested.  
Put soap ends in a pantihose leg and tie around an outdoor faucet for on-the-spot cleanups.
