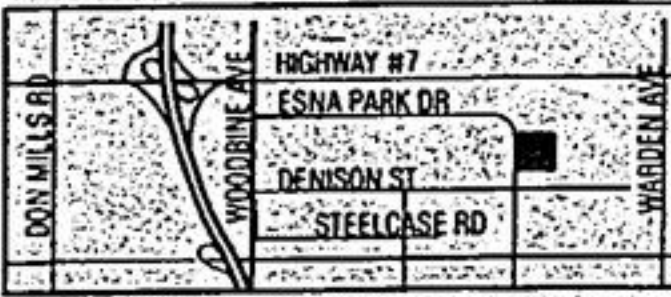

Late Hugh Boyd Churchman honored at service

STOUFFVILLE — It was not a funeral in the true sense of the word, more like a celebration or, in the words of Rev. Craig Pitts, "a home-going—a family reunion".

Such was the atmosphere at a service for Hugh Boyd in the Stouffville Pentecostal Church, Wednesday. Mr Boyd passed away Sept. 17 in Scarborough Centenary Hospital. He'd been a patient there since suffering a fractured hip in fall one week before. He was 90.

Hugh Arthur Boyd was born on the 9th Conc. of Markham, one of eight children in the family of Alexander and Nellie Boyd. Twenty-three years later, he married Ruby Irene Batt, who survives along with two sons, Eldon of Erie, Pennsylvania; Arthur of Atwood; four daughters, Vivian (Mrs George Fletcher) and Doreen Denne of Newmarket; Jean Frost of Scarborough; Bertha (Mrs Heinz Rudolf) of Kassel, Germany; two brothers, Frank of Lomand, Alberta and Harry of Lethbridge, Alberta; four sisters, May Timbers, Markham; Dorothy Stewart, Toronto; Marjorie Pettit, Oshawa; Ruth Johnson, Niagara Falls, New York; 19 grandchildren and 17 great-grandchildren. He was predeceased by a son, Arnold.

Hugh and Ruby Boyd farmed on the 6th Concession of Markham Township (Kennedy Road), prior to their retirement to King City where they lived from 1962 to 1980. They then moved to Parkview Home, Stouffville.

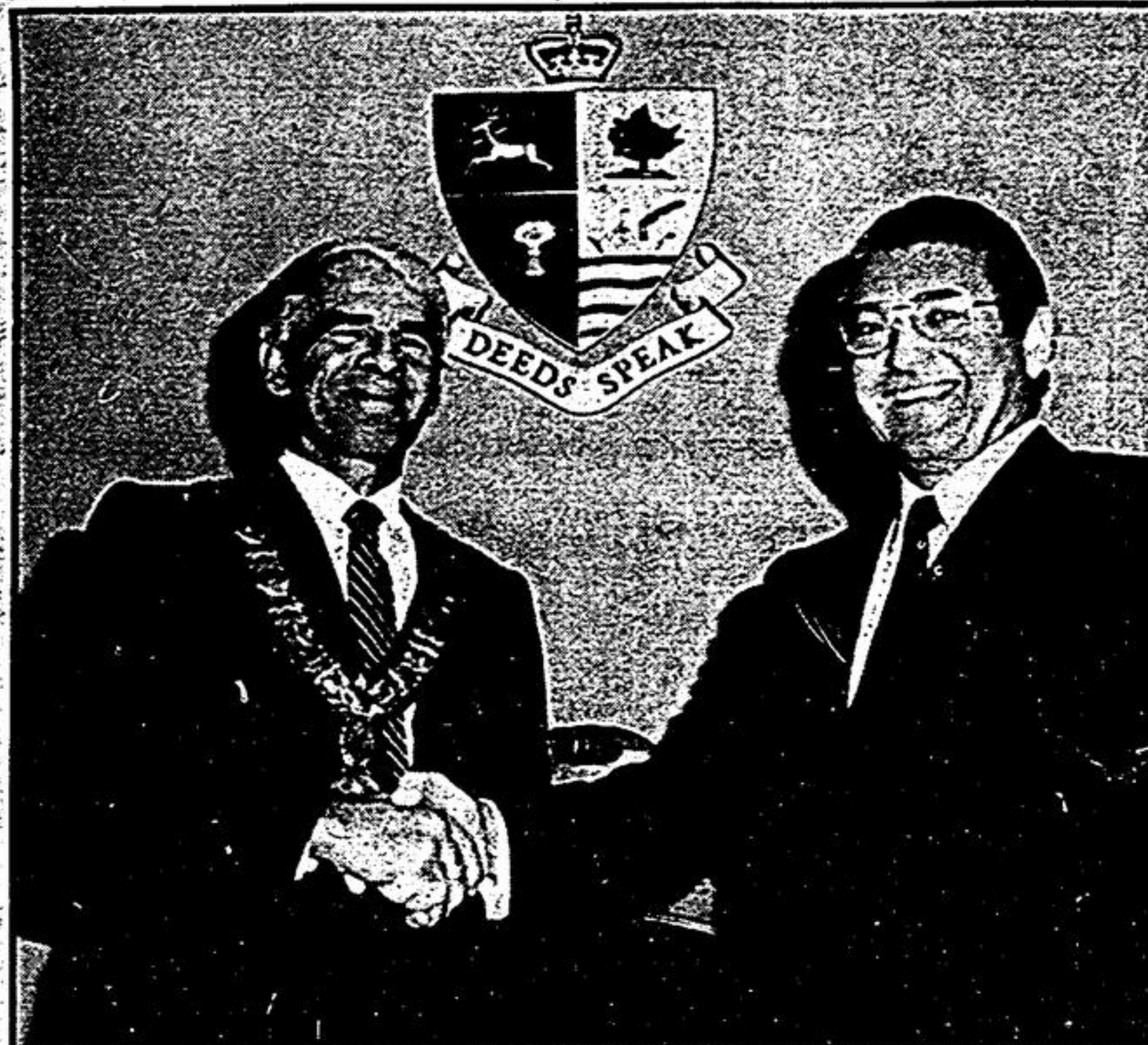
Rev. Pitts told of Mr Boyd's first love, his church. He served on the board of deacons and was a head usher at Evangel Temple, Toronto, many years. "It was almost like he lived there," he said. "He was the first to arrive and the last to leave."

The pastor also spoke of Mr Boyd's love of music. He played the violin, the mouth organ and the piano. He also had a hand in training the well-known Boyd Quartet. "He loved to hear his children sing," Rev. Pitts said.

Appropriately, at the service, two grandchildren, Arlene and Donna Boyd, daughters of Arthur and Joan Boyd of Atwood, rendered two beautiful solos.

Hugh Boyd was a strong supporter of The Gideon Society. He was the oldest member in the Stouffville Chapter.

Pall-bearers were Bruce, Samuel and Bertram Fletcher; Douglas and Donald Frost and David Boyd. Interment was at Elmwood Cemetery, Markham.

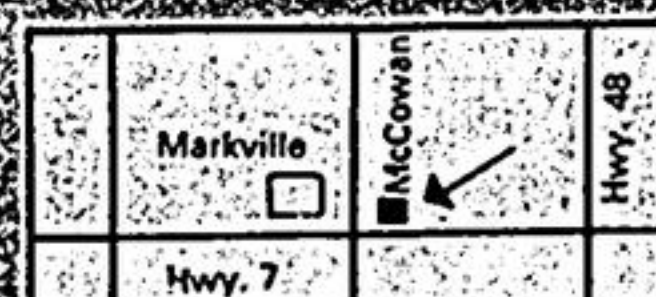
