In 1980 the Town general taxes were actually "REDUCED" and in 1981, 1982, 1983 and 1984 this REDUCED mill rate was CONTINUED which accomplishment reflects beneficial financial stability. You will note, however, that your EDUCATION TAXES HAVE AGAIN BEEN INCREASED FOR 1984 but this cost increase is beyond our jurisdictional control.
