Boxing manager fined - licence suspended

STOUFFVILLE — A former Witchurch-Stouffville resident and highly touted trainer-manager of several top Canadian professional boxers, has had his licence suspended by The Canadian Boxing Association.

Action by the C.B.A. followed a decision by Judge Albert Lampkin that Travis Sugden sliced the glove of boxer Eddie Melo to delay a fight and give his light-heavyweight contender extra rest.

Sugden pleaded not guilty to the mischief to private property charge and plans an appeal.

The accused was fined \$300 and placed on nine months probation. In addition, he was ordered to pay \$200 to replace the ruined glove.

Judge Lampkin said it marked the first time someone has been prosecuted for this type of offence. Evidence showed that Melo's opponent, Gary Summerhays, could have been cut or even blinded by the sliced

glove. "There was potential for tremendous harm," Judge Lampkin concluded.
