The Children's House

Town daycare program with a personal touch

STOUFFVILLE—Day care with a personal touch is the goal of The Children's House.

The new facility, on Church Street North, Stouffville, has brought early childhood education into day care.

"We're trying to deinstitutionalize daycare... to make it more personal," explained co-owner Chris Suzuki.

The philosophy of nursery school education will be prominent at The Children's House, according to Mrs. Suzuki and partner Sue McCammon. Chris and Sue already operate The Children's House Nursery School on Main Street East, and they're making nursery school education an integral part of the daycare operation.

It's organized in learning centres providing music, art, computers, outdoor active play and cooking. Toddlers also participate in developmental programs ranging from simple to complex.

They tend to the physical, as well as the social and emotional requirements of the children, Mrs. Suzuki noted.

There's a toddlers program (with a one-to-five teacher ratio) for children aged 18 months to two-and-a-half years, plus a pre-school program for those in the two-and-a-half to five-year range.

"This is unique in that the entire environment is set up for daycare," she explained. Most other similar facilities are usually renovated areas like church basements.

Preparation of the Church Street location took about three months.

The new Stouffville centre also works closely with the Early Childhood Education program at Seneca College. Students will be taking part in work experience at The Children's House.

The centre has accommodation for 45 children and the operators plan to hire more staff as registration increases.

Qualified ECE workers are Karen Clarkson and Karen Poole. Assistant is Ann Gagnon.

Hours are Monday to Friday from 7:45 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. The school also accepts part-time pupils.
