STOUFFVILLE — The Ministerial Association will continue to provide a counselling service at Stouffville Dist. Secondary School. It was reported at a meeting here, Thursday. Rev. Craig Pitts, Association chairman, praised the cooperation received from Principal John Nikifork and staff teacher Wally Currie. "It's commendable when the high school's doors are open and we're permitted to talk to students so freely," Rev. Pitts said.

Rev. Harley Winborn, a project organizer, stressed the need for a build-up of trust between the pastors and students. He said all issues raised would be treated in the strictest of confidence. Rev. Howard Minaker pointed to "some serious concerns" and "real needs" among a cross-section of young people at the school.
