WHITCHURCH—An 18-year-old Claremont youth is lucky to be alive after his southbound Chevy Nova veered off the 7th Conc. of Whitchurch-Stouffville, (McCowan Road), Saturday, and slammed into a culvert.

Frank Soule, Brock Road, suffered concussion but no broken bones, despite the force of the impact. The front section of his car was cut in half.

The injured driver was rushed to hospital by a nearby resident who heard the crash. His release was expected Tuesday.

Soule is a well-known Claremont area athlete. He was a catcher with the Legion 'Blues', a Midget fast-ball team, that recently won the All-Ontario Championship.

Durham Elementary Teachers' Association Hold development day

DURHAM REGION — The Durham Elementary Teachers' Association will sponsor professional development workshops for elementary school teachers, Nov. 14.

The sessions will deal with subjects ranging from curriculum development to computer use. There will be 33 workshop choices for teachers in the morning and 38 in the afternoon. The varied selection is designed to meet the needs of instructors offering a wide variety of services to Durham Region students.

As well, 30 workshops organized by the Council for Exceptional Children will be open to all teachers. These programs offer the regular classroom instructor a chance to explore new methods of effectively reaching each child, whether slow or gifted.

Speakers for the day include Bruce Mather, Durham's director of education. He'll talk about the pursuit of excellence within the education system. The Nov. 14 activities are part of a board-wide professional development day, involving approximately 2,400

Durham elementary and secondary school teachers. Theme of this year's workshop is 'We Make Us Better', the teachers' way of saying they know the importance of professional growth through the exchange of ideas.
