

Form committee Will hear complaints

The creation of a province-wide residents' complaint committee is one of four new initiatives designed to improve the quality of life in Ontario's nursing homes, Health Minister Keith Norton has announced.

The chairperson is Dr. Dorothea Crittenden, former head of the Ontario Human Rights Commission.

The committee will deal with complaints from residents that pertain to quality of life issues.

Said Mr Norton: "Ontario's more than 29,000 nursing home residents have always been able to raise their complaints with staff and administration. However, I have believed for some time that an external advisory group might be a valuable aid in reviewing complaints originated by residents, their councils or representatives."

New arena on schedule

STOUFFVILLE — Work on the Whitchurch-Stouffville Community Recreation Centre commenced the last week of August. Arthur J. Fish Ltd., General Contractor, moved a trailer and layout crews onto the site the week of Aug. 20. Work commenced the week of Sept. 7.

Mayor Tom Wood reports that, as with any major construction job, many problems have arisen. Each, he says, has been dealt with successfully.

The southerly entrance, the Town was endeavoring to obtain through expropriation, will probably be abandoned, Mayor Wood said. The primary reason for wanting this access, was for site services. The new route for storm and sanitary sewers, gas and underground hydro lines, will now occur

through a Charles Street easement.

The water mains will be connected to the Ninth Line through the north entrance. Mayor Wood admits that, using these service routes, will cost several thousand dollars more, but will result in certain technological benefits. It will also make the expropriation process unnecessary.

The contractor has completed foundation construction and the erection of steel is underway. The pre-cast concrete exterior is scheduled to be put up starting Nov. 14, (today), and should be completed in about two weeks, Mayor Wood said.

"Everything is now substantially on schedule, and we foresee no major change in the project's completion date," the mayor concluded.

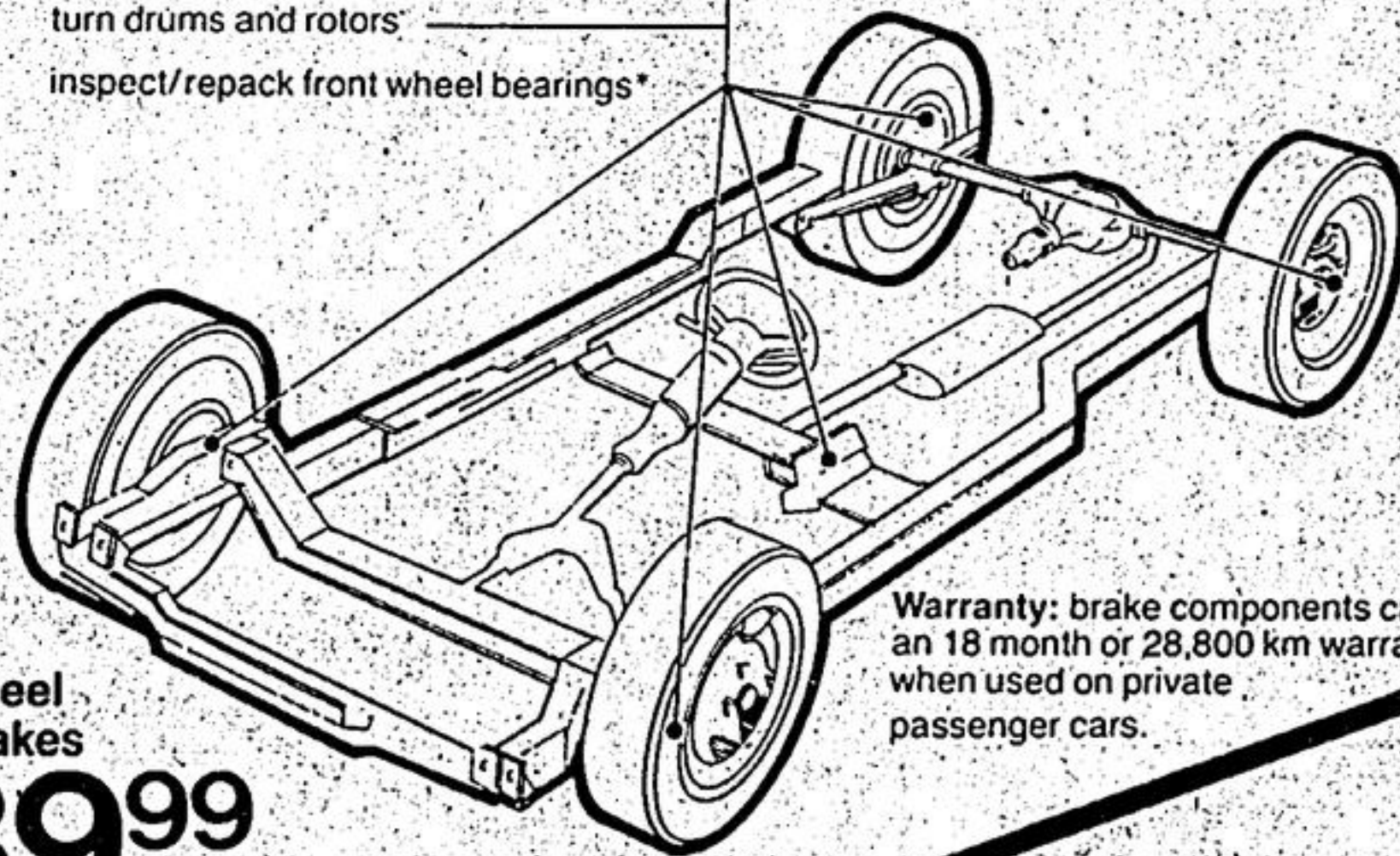
