GBSSA Volleyball title for SDSS

Spartans win senior crown

At the Georgian Bay Volleyball Championships, held at Midland last Thursday, the senior Spartans boys' volleyball team stunned pundits and spectators alike by pulling off an unbelievable win against the St. Theresa Crusaders, to whom they had already lost twice in the preliminaries, to become this year's GBSSA champions.

St. Theresa, ranked fourth in the provincial standings, were favorites to win the event; it is only the fourth time in twelve years that the senior Spartans have won the coveted GBSSA crown.

In round-robin play, the Spartans disposed of both Woodbridge and Parry Sound in two straight

games, Barrie Eastview in three straight, before being outclassed 15-1, 15-2 by the Crusaders.

The final brought the Crusaders and Spartans together for a three-game cliffhanger which will be remembered for years to come. Dropping their opener 11-15, the Spartans rallied to win the second game 15-13, before clinching the title 16-14.

It was a game worthy of champions, and if the enthusiasm of the large crowd Spartan supporters verged on hysteria, who could blame them? Their team had won against all the odds.

Senior Spartan wins this

season include the Pickering High School Invitational Tournament and the York County Championships. They also placed 2nd at Laurentian University and 4th at Oshawa Eastdale College. With 92 games played, their record stands at 70-21-1.

The victorious team members are: Ganesh Persaud, Bernie Schopf, David Elliott, Mike Feasby, Ralph Dube, Rob Reesor, Trevor Young and Gary McGillvary. Coach is Mr Jim Rehill, manager Rose Mauro.

The team go to McMaster University this weekend for the All Ontario Championships.

Peewees lose two in a row

Port Perry went ahead 3-1 in the third period, and with five minutes to go the Clippers came within one when Campbell slipped the puck to Date, whose shot rebounded for McNeil to send it home.

The Clippers got off to a bad start. Lindsay were quick off the mark, scoring two goals in rapid succession to lead 2-0 after the first period. Maintain unbeaten record on home ice

On Friday night the Neil Patrick Novice Clippers kept their unbeaten home record by adding their first win of the season to their previous two home ties; they downed their old rivals from Port Perry 5-4.

The Clippers dominated first period play, emerging with a 4-1 lead. It was, however, the visitors who took the initiative, scoring 30 seconds into the game.

In less than a minute the Clippers had themselves organized and had tied the game. Sean Morrison got the puck to Geoff Smith

whose shot rebounded for Coulter Carconé to bang it in the net.

Halfway through the first Philip Pridham fired the go ahead goal on Smith's pass; less than twenty seconds later Pridham did it again, making it 3-1 for the Clippers on Ryan Jefferson's assist.

Rounding out the first period, Brian Coughlin scored on Brad Goode's pass to make it 4-1.

Second period action saw the Clippers give up a goal when Dwayne Vanderligt was beaten to the corner on

a nice two-way play by the visitors.

Defenceman Jason Reesor scored what eventually proved to be the winning goal, intercepting the puck just outside the Port Perry blue line, he blasted it into the net for his first goal of the season.

A few Clipper defensive lapses saw the visitors come within a goal of tying the game. However, the Clippers hung on to weather the Port Perry thrusts.

Next Clippers will play an exhibition game at home this Friday at 7 pm.
