

# New home for nursery

STOUFFVILLE — Heather Preece, operator of Chick-A-Dee Day Nursery School, is excited about her upcoming move.

After a long search and refusals at two other locations, Chick-A-Dee, now based at Christ Church Anglican on Sunset Boulevard, will soon relocate to 34 Albert Street South.

"We're really looking forward to being at the new location," Heather says. "And

the children are really excited also. They're helping us get ready for the move."

Heather, a certified Early Childhood Education (ECE) teacher, enjoyed the stay at Christ Church, but now wants a more "permanent" setting.

"It'll be nice to be in a place where we can set things up and leave them up," Heather says. "We think this will be better for the boys and girls."

Right now, the nursery school is awaiting issuance of a building permit before moving to the Albert Street site. Installation of a fire exit and other interior finishing are required.

The top two floors of the home will be occupied by the children and the basement will serve as Heather's residence.

Attendance averages about 30 children a day, according to Heather, and this is expected to increase slightly following the move.
