Farmers to get soil help

Every year Ontario farmers lose about \$68-million in agricultural productivity from erosion. Wind and spring run-off strip good, productive soil from the land, increasing the cost of production. This year, however, the Ministry of Agriculture and Food has created a new \$600,000 program

to help farmers conserve their soil. The new program will create an expansion of advisory services already available from the Ministry. A total of 14 new soil experts will be hired as field staff to work under the on-going Soil Conservation and Environmental Protection Assistance Program.

These field experts will help farmers deal with the challenge of soil erosion and waste leakage. They will encourage better management of soil and crops through practical advice and education.

Run-off from agricultural lands, including soil erosion, has contributed to some extent with water quality problems.

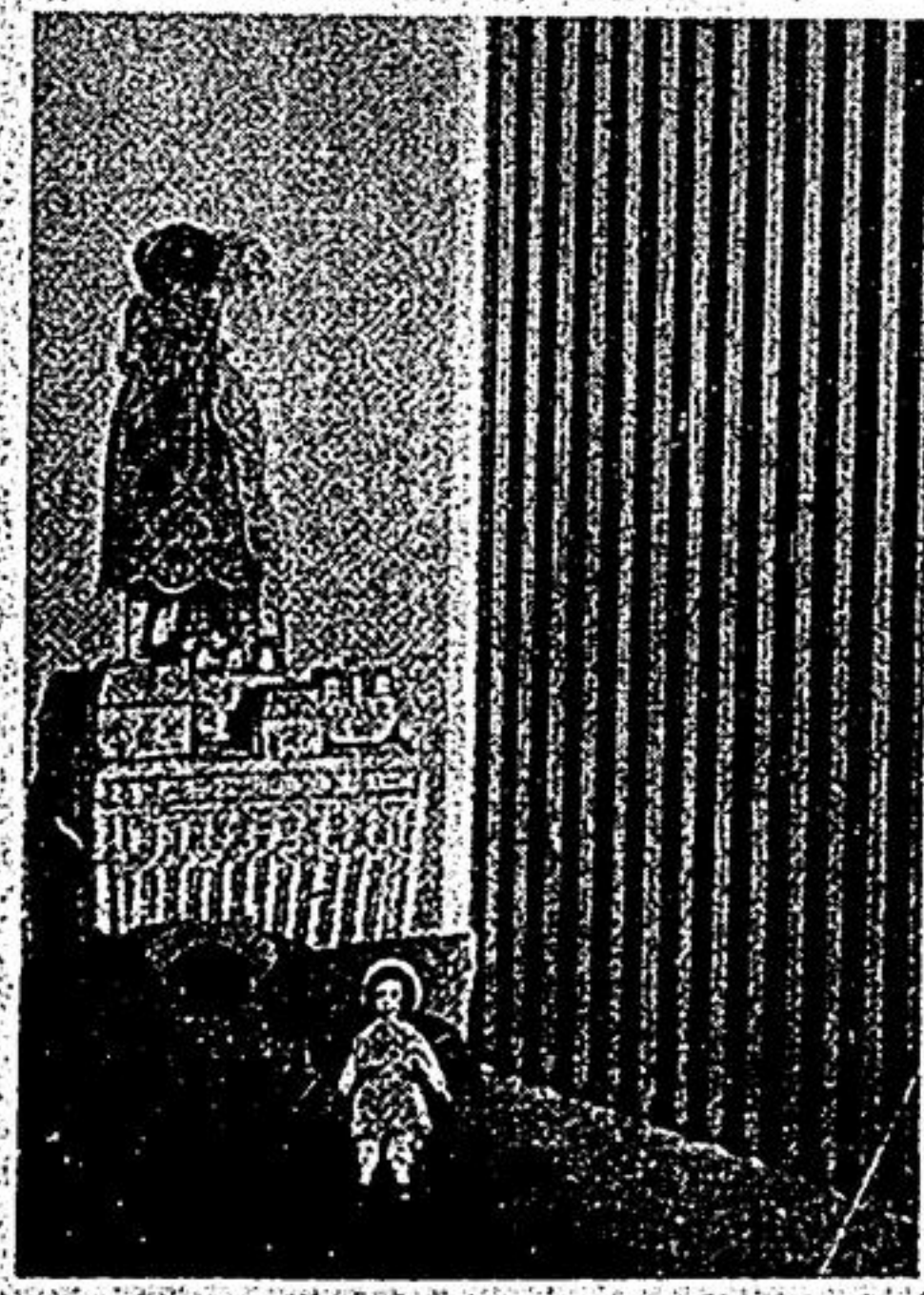
