# Union squad reach final Peewee tourney won by Alliston

After two convincing wins against powerful opposition, the home-grown Credit Union Clippers looked set to win their own tourney last weekend. Unfortunately it was not to be. Their performance in the championship final, against Alliston, turned out to be mediocre and something of a let down for the large number of fans who turned up to cheer them on.

Opening against Markham, the Clippers left it late in the game before forging ahead with four goals in the final frame.

Jamie Campbell led the scoring with a hat trick and an assist, Drae Glover added a pair and an assist with singles coming from Jason Underwood and Guy Frederick.

A spirited encounter between Unionville and Richmond Hill saw the fancied Unionville squad edged 9-8, setting the stage for what should have been an exciting semi-final between Richmond Hill and their hosts - it wasn't. The game turned into a 6-0 route by the Clippers.

Skipper Underwood collected a hat trick and an assist, while Glover and Campbell added a pair each. Clipper goalie Basil Luciano came up with several spectacular saves for the shutout.

The Clippers were a shadow of their former selves in their championship encounter against Alliston. They simply couldn't find the net. In fact, with the exception of Glover's solitary marker, the only highlight in their 3-1 loss, they were very flat indeed.

The Consolation round ended in controversy when Cobourg, the eventual winners, lodged a protest over the Unionville goaltenders stick. The protest was upheld and Unionville took a two minute penalty; Cobourg snatching the opportunity to score on the powerplay and finding the net again minutes later for a 3-2 win.

In the Consolation semi-final rounds, Cobourg defeated Brooklin-Whitby 3-0 and Unionville downed Markham in an exciting, high-scoring 10-9 finish.
