A pizza parlor plus

WHITCHURCH — Long hours and personal service have made Judy's Pizzeria Restaurant an unqualified business success. However, Michael and Judy Apreda haven't been content to rest on those laurels. They've transformed their premises into a lovely dining lounge. A grand re-opening was held Thursday.

Located at the corner of the Aurora Road and the 6th Concession, Judy's is known far and wide for its delicious pizza. It's also known for its friendliness. Michael and Judy along with sons Ralph and Carman and daughter Michelina (Mickey), can call most of their customers by name.

It was ten years ago that Mr and Mrs Apreda moved from Agincourt to Whitchurch-Stouffville. To build up the business, the entire family, (six

sons and two daughters), pitched in, some part-time and some full-time. Mickey describes it as "a family affair".

It was last winter they put their collective heads together and decided on major renovations. Work commenced in June and, six months later, the completed project was unveiled. Mickey admits they're proud of what they've accomplished. She estimates the cost at "between thirty-five and forty thousand dollars."

The remodelled interior represents "everyone's ideas," Mickey said. The dining lounge concept's completely new.

Mickey says it's not unusual for her parents to work 16 hours a day, seven days a week. She hopes they'll take life a little easier as her brother Joe assumes more of a managerial role.
