

Arthur David Hewitt Respected by friends

Arthur David Hewitt, a resident at R.R. 1, Unionville and well-known in Kincardine-area communities, passed away at Sunnybrook Medical Centre, Toronto, Dec. 4, following a short illness.

The son of Albert E. Hewitt and the late Mabel (Stringer) Hewitt of Kincardine, he is survived by his wife Diane; son David, Toronto; daughters Gwenyth of Ottawa; and Gillian, Unionville; and a brother John of Willowdale.

Born at Kincardine in 1936, Arthur attended Millerton Public School and Kincardine District High School. Following graduation from Ontario Agricultural College of the University of Toronto in 1958, he served for 26 years in various locations and capacities with Imperial Oil Limited of Toronto, including a period in Edmonton from 1972 to 1976.

He received a Master's degree in business administration from York University in 1970.

Arthur maintained his early interest in agriculture and was actively involved in operating the family farm at Millerton until his untimely death. He was active in the affairs of his church and recently completed a term as Clerk of Session.

Funeral services, held Dec. 7, at Brown's Corners United Church and at the MacKenzie-McCrea Funeral Home, Kincardine, were attended by many friends and neighbors. Rev. Ainsley Croft officiated. Pall-bearers were George Arnold, Allan Grunder, Lloyd Clark, David Snyder, Gerry Poffenroth and Harvey Brown. Interment was in Kincardine Cemetery.

Under the chairmanship of Clara Stout, the committee has arranged for a showcase of talent, an event somewhat unique in Stouffville's


history, to be held Monday, Jan. 14 beginning at 1 p.m., in the Silver Jubilee Club.

Using the age-old mixture of charm and per-


