For Bowmanville the game was pure academic. The four straight 1985 league champions will probably end up sweeping the opposition under the mat.

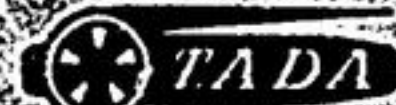
