# Schulz leads swimmers

Stephanie Schulz ran roughshod over the opposition taking three firsts to lead the Markham Aquatic Club (MAC) swimmers at two meets last week.

Schulz competed in the 13- and 14-year-old girls' section at the Central Region Invitational Meet. Her firsts came in the 100-metre butterfly and freestyle and the 200-m. breaststroke.

In the same division, MAC's Kelly Stafford topped the 400-m. freestyle and took a sixth in the 200-m. backstroke and eighth in the 50-m. freestyle.

Renee Altmann won the 200-m. freestyle, finished second in the 200-m. individual medley and 100-m. butterfly, and earned fourth in the 100-m. backstroke.

Julia Williams was fourth in the 200-m. freestyle and sixth in the 50-m. freestyle.

For the 10-and-younger girls Stephanie Escott led the way with a first in the 200-m. freestyle, second in the 100-m. freestyle (ahead of Holly Porteous, who was third and Bonnie Kilpatrick, who was eighth) and third in the 100-m. butterfly (Porteous was fourth).

Jennifer Keogh won the 100-m. backstroke (Suzanne Dixon was third and Kim Orr fourth), came second in the 50-m. freestyle and fourth in the 50-m. butterfly (two places ahead of Orr).

Dixon was second in the 100-m. butterfly and seventh in the 100-m. breaststroke (Porteous finished fourth and Orr was eighth).

Karla Klein was fifth in the 50-m. freestyle and Kilpatrick eighth.

Kristina Baker led the 11-and-12-year-old girls with a second in the 200-m. individual medley; fifth in the 50-m. freestyle (one spot behind Karen Jones), fourth in the 100-m. breaststroke and second in the 200-m. butterfly.

Michelle Field was third in the 100-m. butterfly and sixth in the 200-m. freestyle. Jones was third in the 200-m. freestyle and fourth in the 100-m. freestyle.

Karen Porteous earned sixths in the 200-m. breaststroke and backstroke. In 100-m. events Sheri Stewart finished sixth in the butterfly and eighth in the backstroke.

Julie Klein was first in the 200-m. freestyle, third in the 200-m. backstroke (Melanie Mackwood was fourth and Charlotte Curgenven fifth) and sixth in the 200-m. individual medley (Mackwood was eighth).

For the 15-and-over girls Rena Grunert earned a third in the 50-m. freestyle and sevenths in the 100-m. freestyle and backstroke.

Tyler Cave led the 10-and-younger boys with a first in the 200-m. freestyle (Andy McCartney was second), third in the 100-m. freestyle (Nicholas Luck was fourth), fifth in the 50-m. freestyle and sixth in the 50-m. butterfly (Luck was fifth).

McCartney finished with seconds in 100-m. backstroke and breaststroke, plus a fourth in the 50-m. freestyle (Luck was third).

For the 11-and-12-year-old boys, Dalen

Sharp was second in the 200-m. freestyle (Matthew Cardwell was third, Jason Dickinson fifth and Todd Baren sixth). Sharp was also fifth in the 200-m. backstroke (Dickinson was sixth) and seventh in the 100-m. backstroke.

Dickinson finished third in the 200-m. breaststroke (Jason Dixon was fourth).

David Ferguson earned fourths in the 13- and 14-year-old boys' 200-m. breaststroke and 100-m. freestyle. Greg Curgenven finished third in the 100-m. backstroke.

Sergio Bogani took third in the 200-m. freestyle and sixth in the 100-m. butterfly. In the 15-and-older boys section, Mark Klein was second in the 100-m. butterfly, fifth in the 100-m. freestyle (Ed Palmer was eighth) and seventh in the 100-m. breaststroke.

Palmer also earned a fourth in the 200-m. freestyle.

At the Ontario Club II meet, Wendy Johnston was third in the 200-m. breaststroke consolation and sixth in the 100-m. breaststroke consolation.

Ken Ahlberg picked up a fifth in the 100-m. freestyle consolation and Maria Lember was eighth in the 800-m. freestyle.

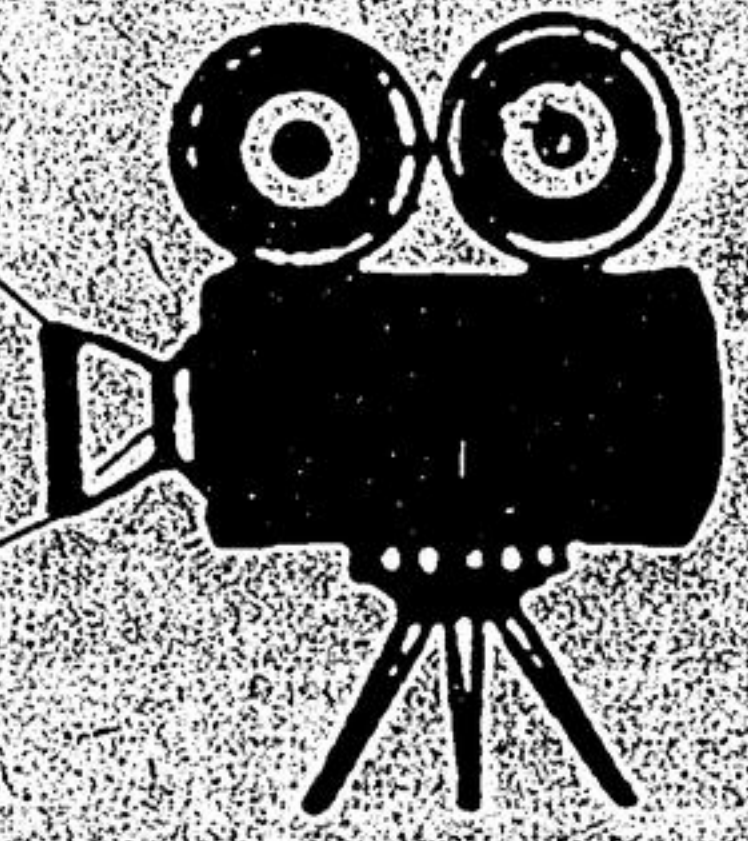
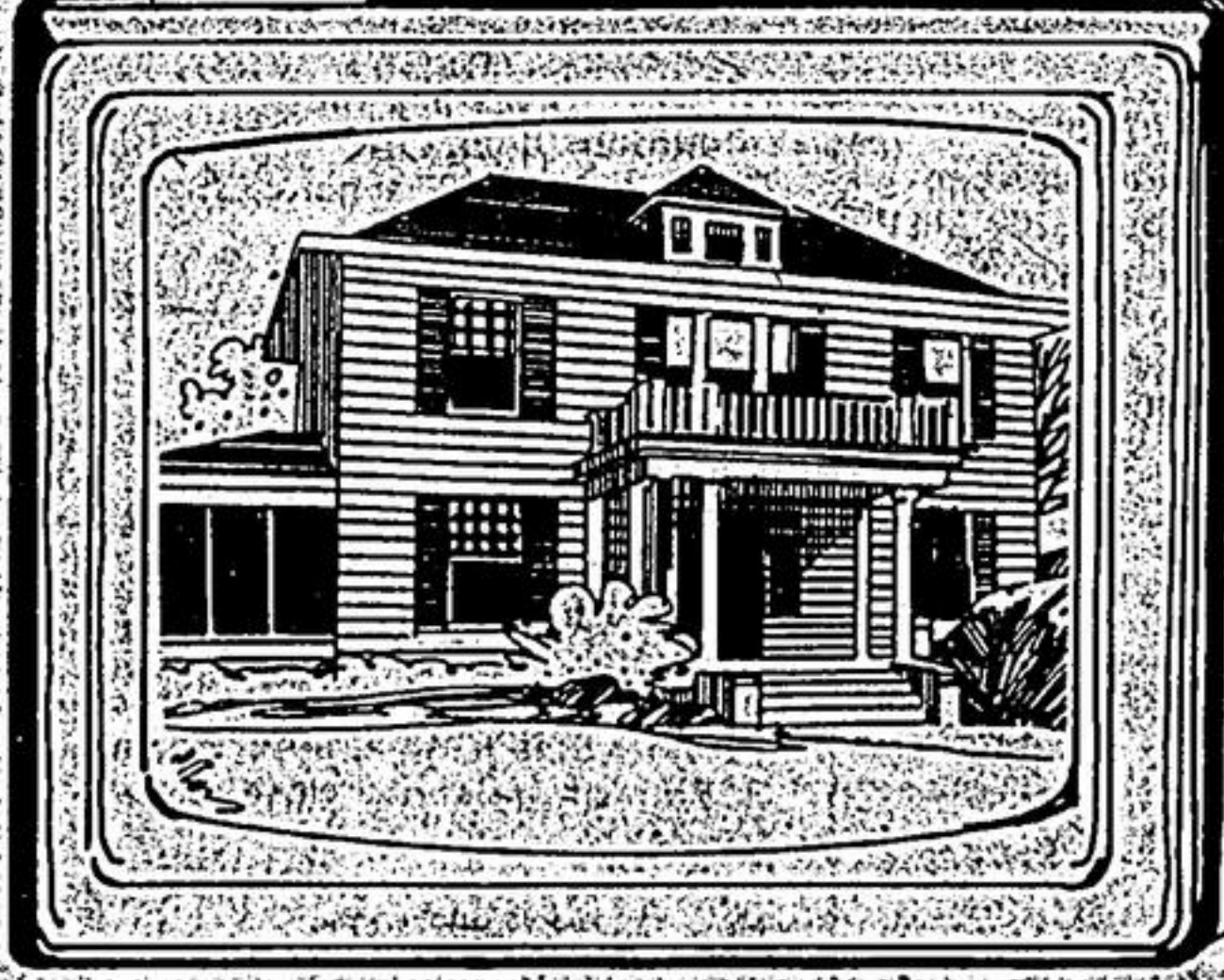
