Brougham is energized

BROUGHAM — Community revitalization has begun in Brougham through the initiative of DCC Environmental Services. Renovations using new energy conservation technology are well underway on a century-old heritage home in the rural hamlet.
 Manager Jeff Rockburn says the project will provide tangible evidence that energy efficient techniques are effective and economic.
 "A super-insulated retrofit will conserve energy and cut heating costs substantially," he explained.
 The project's objective is to serve Durham Region as a self-supporting, energy conservation and demonstration centre, according to Mr. Rockburn. Practical information, services, workshops and seminars will be offered to help residents improve their home energy efficiency.
 The Brougham building will include a conservation store, weatherization service, retail spaces for small businesses, shops and/or studio space for local artists and craftspeople, as well as a restaurant and tea room.
 The Ajax-Pickering recycling program will continue as a practical resource use and waste management project.
 A recent survey of Brougham residents showed that 75 per cent are in favor of the development of self-supporting environmental and community programs.
 Mr. Rockburn feels the centre's planned activities and businesses will provide a valuable boost to the local economy and a sense of community spirit.
 DCC Environmental Services is a non-profit organization serving Durham Region since the formation of a recycling program and a weatherization service in 1983. It was formerly known as the Durham Conservation Centre.
