PUBLIC MEETING Proposed Zoning By-law Amendment TUESDAY, MARCH 19, 1985, 7:30 P.M.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, MUNICIPAL OFFICES, BUTTONVILLE, ONTARIO
8911 Woodbine Avenue, Markham, Ontario

A Public Meeting will be held by the Planning Committee of the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Markham to consider a proposed amendment to By-law 165-80 under Section 34 of the Planning Act 1983.

The subject property consists of Part of Lots 9 to 14 Inclusive, Concession 3, and Part of Lots 9 to 11 Inclusive, Concession 4, as shown on the map below.

The proposed by-law would expand the area of By-law 165-80 and zone the added lands as Select Industrial and Limited Commercial (Holding), (H)M.C. 60%, Open Space (01), and Institutional and Open Space (02). The proposed by-law also incorporates the Open Space (01) and Institutional and Open Space (02) zones and development standards for those zones into By-law 165-80.

The proposed by-law would permit the development of the lands added to By-law 165-80 for industrial and related commercial uses and for institutional uses such as the Unionville High School and the Markham Theatre. The valleylands of the Rouge River are zoned Open Space (01).


The purpose of this meeting is to ensure that adequate information is made available to the public and to afford any person the opportunity to make representations in respect of the proposed zoning by-law amendment. If you are unable to attend the meeting, your representation can be filed in writing either by mail or personal delivery to reach the office of the Planning Director not later than March 19, 1985.

The proposed zoning by-law amendment and additional information relating thereto are available for inspection in the Planning Department, second floor, 8911 Woodbine Avenue between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday, or further information may be obtained by telephoning the Planning Department at 477-7000, extension 224 during the same hours.


AREA TO BE ADDED TO BY-LAW 165-80 AND LANDS TO BE ZONED (H) M.C. 60%, 01 & 02


