

# Tournament a learning experience

EDMONTON — Reality eventually caught up with the Uxbridge Tigers after an impressive start at the Victoria Redmen Invitational basketball tournament. Uxbridge Secondary School's senior boys' team posted a 52-44 victory over the Leboldus Golden Suns of Regina, Sask., in their tourney opener Wednesday.

That placed them on the championship side of the classic, setting up a meeting with the top-seeded Queen Elizabeth Lions of Halifax, N.S.

It was at this stage that the roof began to cave in.

The Tigers received 13-point performances from forward Dave Anderson and guard Terry Reesor, but it wasn't nearly enough.

The defending tournament champion Lions, led by multi-talented swing-guard Jason Wilson, turned on the jets in the

second half to cruise to a 86-53 win. Things didn't get any easier for Uxbridge the rest of the way.

The team lost its remaining two games — 92-66 to fast-breaking Tec. Voc. Hornets of Winnipeg, Man., and 90-58 to Edmonton's St. Joseph Composite High School Saints — to finish with a 1-3 win-loss record, good for tenth place in the 16-team boys' field.

Toronto's Runnymede Redmen overpowered Queen Elizabeth Lions 98-77 in Saturday's entertaining A flight final.

The fifth annual tournament, generally regarded as Canada's unofficial high school basketball championship, was played Feb. 6 to 9 at Victoria Composite High School in Edmonton.

U.S.S. coach Jim Schwan feels his players will definitely benefit from their Edmonton court experience.

"We should be strong going into the playoffs," he said in reference to upcoming post-season action in the Lake Ontario secondary school loop.

Carl Orr, Terry Reesor, and Dave Anderson were standouts for Uxbridge at the Redmen classic, according to coach Schwan.

Anderson led the scoring attack in the Leboldus victory with 18 points, while Reesor rainbowed 12 and Andrew McIlwride added another eight.

Against Winnipeg's Tech. Voc., the 6'4" Anderson was again Uxbridge's top pointer with 20. Carl Orr had 12, Colin Mackie nine and Reesor eight.

Anderson and Reesor collected 14 apiece against St. Joseph Saints, while Harold Kim chipped in eight and Gord Weatherup six.

**TOURNAMENT NOTES** — Colin Mackie, a 6'3" Uxbridge Tiger centre,

slam dunked his way to fifth place in a contest featuring that dynamic basketball skill. Colin's style pleased the capacity crowd at Edmonton's Victoria Composite High School. On the other hand, the West Humber Vikings went on to capture the slam dunk crown, Saturday.

The event was a special feature of the fifth annual Victoria Redmen Invitational. Even though they were a long way from home, the U.S.S. Tigers enjoyed excellent crowd support throughout the four-day event. The boys were boosted by an attractive group of cheerleaders from Scarborough's Cedarbrae Collegiate Institute. The girls placed a strong seventh in the tournament's cheerleading competition, won for the fourth consecutive year by the host Victoria Redmen squad.

Runnymede's Mark Henry, a 6'6" forward, was named the tournament's most valuable male player.

Uxbridge coach Jim Schwan and bench generals from other competing teams praised tournament officials for their top-notch organization. A total of 24 high schools played four days of virtually non-stop basketball.

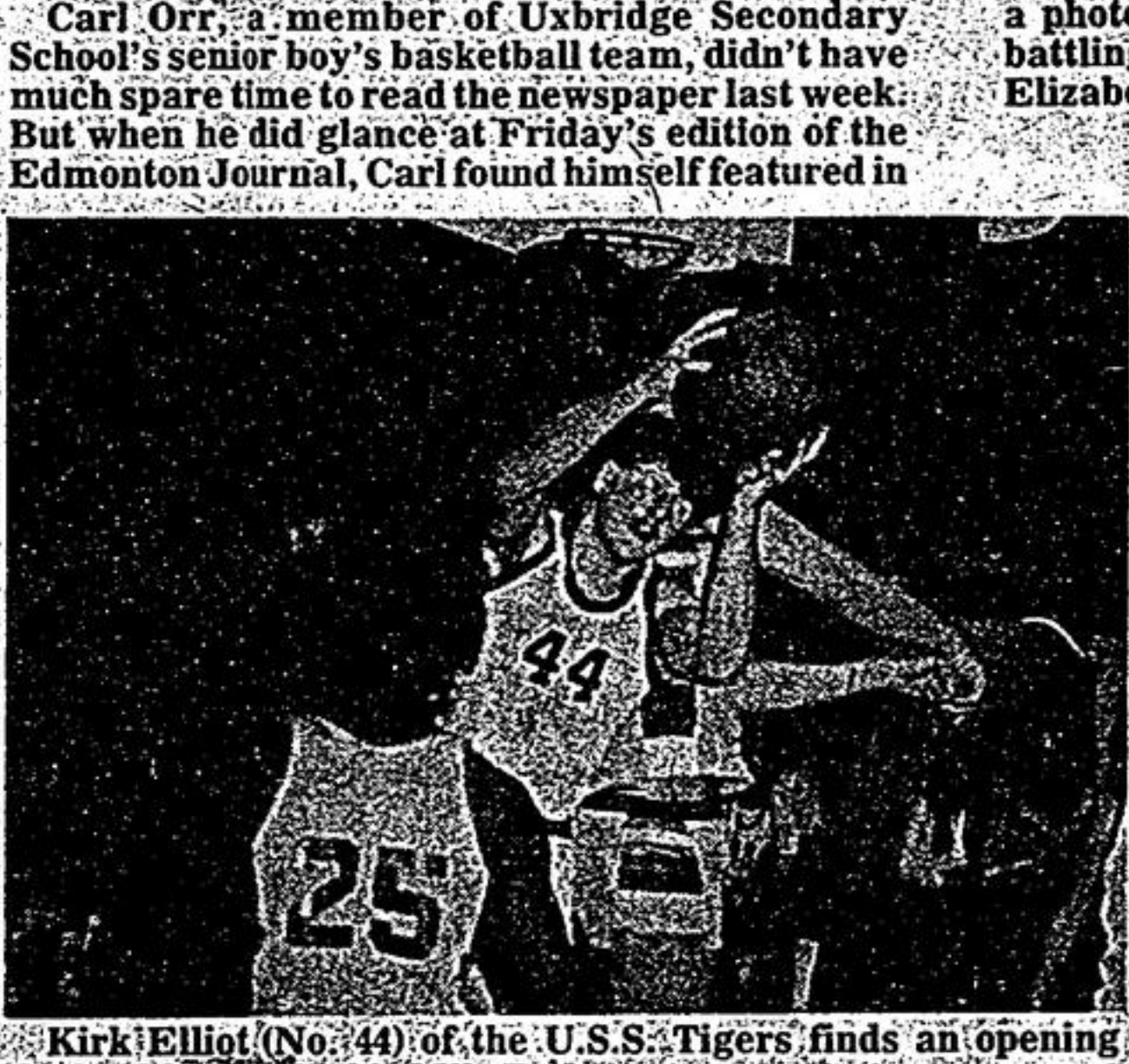
