Passes in Saskatoon

Clayton Sherven Davis of 517 Glasgow Street, Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, passed away in a local hospital, Feb. 1. He was 60.

Clayton was born and raised in the Naicam district of Saskatchewan, the son of Ace and Emma Davis, formerly of Stouffville.

He served overseas in the Royal Canadian Airforce during World War II, 1942 to 1946.

In 1947, he married Edith Gustafson of Kelliber, Saskatchewan and they operated the LeRoy Hotel until 1963. He was the LeRoy Town Overseer for seven years and very active in sports, especially baseball and hockey. He operated the Bazaar and Novelty Company with his family until his passing.

Surviving, besides his wife, is one daughter, Joan, of Victoria, British Columbia; two sons, Doug and his wife, Norine, Dave and his wife, Carol; four grandchildren, Erica and Bradley; Brent and Krista, all of Saskatoon. Surviving also are two sisters, Mrs Margaret Jones and Mrs Lois Rowe, both of Okanagan Falls, British Columbia and two brothers, Jack of Quill Lake, Saskatchewan and Eric of Naicam, Saskatchewan.

A memorial service was held at St. Martin's United Church, Feb. 6, conducted by Rev. R. J. Thompson.
