Uxbridge man injured in icicle altercation

UXBRIDGE — A 19-year-old Uxbridge man received serious facial lacerations when struck by a chunk of ice during a Feb. 16 altercation on Brock Street.

A dispute began between a group of patrons inside Evelyn's Restaurant in downtown Uxbridge, according to a Durham Regional Police report. It carried out onto the street Saturday at about 1:30 a.m. Two members of the group were involved in a conflict, when a third party attempted to intervene and was hit with some icicles by one of the original combatants, police said.

Wesley Jackson,

19, of Centre Road North, was taken to Uxbridge Cottage Hospital and treated for severe cuts to the head. Numerous stitches were required to close his

wounds. Police have charged a 31-year-old Plank Street, Uxbridge, man with assault with a dangerous weapon. The accused is

scheduled to appear in court at Pickering, Feb. 26. Reports theft Durham Regional Police received a report of a stolen auto Feb. 17. Paul Henry

Robinson, Plank Street, Uxbridge, said his 1975 model Grand Prix was stolen while parked on Bascom Street. The case is still under investigation.

Fight child abuse

DURHAM REGION — More funds are required to help Durham Region Children's Aid Society wage its battle against the sexual abuse of children.

The Society is requesting a 19.7 per cent budget increase this year to bring its funding up to \$5.5 million. It was submitted to Durham Region Council for approval, Monday.

The society's executive director, Bob Penney, points to a dramatic increase of reported cases of sexually abused children in the region.

There were 183 cases of sexual abuse in the region during 1984, as compared to 97 cases in 1983 and a 38 in 1982, he noted. This represents an 88 per cent increase last year

alone. It's estimated that child care costs will jump by about 25 per cent because children now entering the society's care tend to have emotional problems that require treatment in more expensive residential settings, he explained.

Although incidences of physical abuse grew less dramatically over the same period, there was still a 28 per cent increase from 1983 to 1984.

"You are working with frightening numbers," Mr. Penney said. "People say one out of four girls is sexually abused in one way or another by the time they are 18."

Durham Region has 85,000 children under 18 and half of these are girls, according to the executive director.

"When you think that one in four of these are sexually abused, the numbers are ridiculous," he added.

Mr. Penney doesn't believe the number of cases of sexual abuse of children is increasing substantially, because there is now better public awareness and more people are reporting this kind of conduct.
