Town investigating methods to expand recycling program

STOUFFVILLE — The Town will investigate the possibility of expanding its waste recycling program.

Ward 6 Councillor Jim Sanders supports further cost-saving measures outlined by Paul Taylor, executive director of the Recycling Council of Ontario.

Mr. Taylor, who was special guest speaker at the 10th anniversary celebration of the Whitechurch-Stouffville Recycling Group in December, 1984, suggested the Town could possibly recover three or four times as much waste for recycling as is now achieved.

He said proposed changes in provincial legislation, involving the introduction of new, recyclable soft drink containers, may be a factor.

"At some point, I believe, the feasibility of curbside collections should be looked at, given the latest advances in collection methods and market strength," Mr. Taylor said in a letter to Councillor Sanders, dated Dec. 10, 1984.

Funding is available from the province to assist with such feasibility studies, as well as to cover any operating losses through the first three years of expansion, the executive director explained.

He suggested the Town obtain further information from Adam Ciulini at the Waste Management Branch, Ontario Ministry of the Environment.

Council accepted Mr. Sander's recommendation that the Town meet with Mr. Ciulini to inquire about available funding strategies for including recycling incentives in the Town's garbage contract, and feasibility study for an expanded waste recycling program in Whitechurch-

Stouffville. Preparation of a 10-year waste recycling plan in co-operation with the Whitechurch-Stouffville Recycling group will also be discussed.

Donna Brown, president of the local recycling organization, will be invited to attend that session.

Durham Board of Education

Approve upgrading

DURHAM REGION — Upgrading of library facilities at Greenbank and Rosebank Public Schools is scheduled to take place during 1985.

The Durham Board of Education approved these projects at its Feb. 11 meeting.

The work, subject to finance committee approval, will include the addition of a portable at Rosebank as well as classroom conversion at both schools.

The board also approved a five-year plan for library

improvements, subject to an annual review and depending upon the availability of funds.

The following library upgrading projects are scheduled: year one — Palmerston Public School, Greenbank P.S. and Rosebank P.S.; year 2 — Epsom P.S., Frenchman's Bay P.S., Durham Alternative (Westmount) and Cartwright H.S.; year 3 — Woodcrest P.S., Sir John A. MacDonald P.S., Bayview Heights P.S. and General Vanier S.S.; year 4 — Whit-

by Senior P.S., Duffin's Bay P.S., Scott Central P.S. and Eastdale C.V.I.; year 5 — Grandview P.S., Kathleen Rowe P.S., Fairport Beach P.S. and Anderson C.V.I.

The Board's new music policy states: "It is the goal of the Durham Board of Education that all Grade 7 and 8 students shall have the opportunity to experience both a vocal and instrumental music program as part of regular day school education." The policy regulations provide for

phasing-in of funding for basic minimum instrumentation for a class of 35 students in each school with Grade 8 and/or Grade 7 students. Larger schools will be equipped with enough instruments to reach a ratio of three students to each instrument to a maximum of three class sets.
