

Commuters face fare hike

UXBRIDGE — cents more for Go Transit bus service to downtown Toronto, beginning March 23.

The fare hike coincides with the scheduled opening of the Light Rapid Transit (LRT) line running from the Scarborough Town Centre to Kennedy station.

This move is designed to encourage commuters to use the LRT and subway for the last legs of the trip rather than staying on the Go bus, according to a Go Transit spokesperson.

The Go bus fee, now \$4.50 one way to Toronto from Uxbridge, will climb to \$5.10. The increase also affects passengers from towns between Uxbridge and Markham, including Goodwood and Stouffville.

Uxbridge riders can also pay \$4 to travel to the Town Centre by Go bus, then spend 95 cents on the LRT and subway downtown.

The fare to the Town Centre will not be affected by the March 23 increase.

Only those people riding the Go bus past the Town Centre into the downtown core will feel the pinch, the spokesperson added.
